
- To promote and advance the secure, efficient, and effective use of health information

- Over 1,000 Colorado citizens participated
- Roadmap development spanned sixteen (16) months
- The Roadmap identified Objectives and Initiatives
- The OeHI Budget represents nine (9) of sixteen (16) initiatives
  - Where we're ready to fund initiatives
  - Where funding aligns with 90/10 matching opportunity (to 2021)



- 1. Ease quality reporting burden

- 4. Implement consumer portal
- 5. Advance HIEs (CORHIO, QHN)
- 6. Support care coordination
- 7. Create a Health IT Program Management Office (PMO)
- 8. Lead a process for statewide data governance
- 9. Use a systems integrator; create a statewide architecture

- Aligns with, and supports, the State Innovation Model (SIM):

  - Consent Management
  - Data Governance
  - Systems Integrator / Systems Architecture
- Opportunity for 90/10 federal matching over next three years (to 2021)

## Why these Initiatives, Why now? (cont.)


- Engages consumers in their health, and health care
