House Bill 19-1331	Concerning removing the limit on the departments with which the evidence-based practices implementation for capacity resource center can collaborate. <i>(Note: This bill was <u>not initiated by CCJJ</u>, but expanded a previous CCJJ-related bill, HB 13-1129, regarding the EPIC Resource Center.)</i>	Signed
Senate Bill 19-036	Concerning requiring the state court administrator to administer a program to remind criminal defendants to appear in court as scheduled. <i>(Note: This bill was <u>not initiated by CCJJ</u>, but included elements of CCJJ Recommendation FY19-PR #10.)</i>	Signed
