




# County Administered Child Welfare Services

### SB21-277 requires:

- An updated workload study; and
- A vendor-developed funding model that reflects total funding needs across the child welfare system







### History of Child Welfare Staffing Allocation (242)


Original Workload Study: SB 15-242 which is now synonymous with our Staffing Portion, "242 Funding" of the Child Welfare Model.

New Workload Study: SB 21-277, among other things, pushed the Child Welfare Funding Model and the New Workload Study to be competed.

#### **Workload Study Results**

Original Workload Study Recommendations: 696 Staff

Funded from Original Workload Recommendations: 419

Remaining need from Original Workload Recommendations: 277

Total Recommendation for New Workload Study: 343
