

Timothy Montoya Task Force Interim Committee Update - July 2023

BACKGROUND

Named after a 12-year-old who was hit and killed by a car shortly after running away from his out-of-home placement in June 2020, the General Assembly formed this task force to study youth who run from child welfare placements and develop a consistent, prompt and effective response by analyzing:

- Coordinated response between entities
- Resources necessary to improve coordinated efforts
