**BILL TOPIC:** Applying Artificial Intelligence to Fight Wildfire

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101CONCERNING THE APPLICATION OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TO102PREDICT, PREVENT, OR ASSIST IN FIGHTING WILDFIRES, AND, IN

103 CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

## **Bill Summary**

**Wildfire Matters Review Committee.** The bill requires the general assembly to appropriate \$7,500,000 to the division of fire prevention and control (division) for state fiscal year 2024-25 and allows any unexpended portion of the appropriation to also be expended in state fiscal year 2025-26. The division is required to use the money to study

Dashes through the words indicate deletions from existing law. and develop applications of artificial intelligence that predict, mitigate, or assist in fighting wildfires, including, at a minimum, applications of artificial intelligence which produce data that can be incorporated into maps displaying the following:

- Classification of vegetation and wildfire fuel;
- Predictions regarding the likelihood of wildfire ignition potential in a particular area following observed lightning events;
- The perimeter of an ongoing wildfire; and
- Predictions regarding the locations and area to which an ongoing wildfire may spread.

The division may contract with a third party that has developed artificial intelligence tools to predict, mitigate, or assist in fighting wildfires. The division is also authorized to seek, accept, and expend gifts, grants, and donations for the purposes of the bill.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-33.5-1241 as
- 3 follows:

24-33.5-1241. Applying artificial intelligence to predict,
prevent, or assist in fighting wildfires - definition. (1) AS USED IN THIS
SECTION, "ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET
FORTH IN SECTION 2-3-1701 (1).

8 (2) FOR THE 2024-25 STATE FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL 9 ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE SEVEN MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND 10 DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE DIVISION TO BE USED IN 11 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION. ANY UNEXPENDED OR UNENCUMBERED 12 MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2) REMAINS 13 AVAILABLE FOR EXPENDITURE FOR THE SAME PURPOSES IN THE 2025-26 14 STATE FISCAL YEAR WITHOUT FURTHER APPROPRIATION.

15 (3) THE DIVISION SHALL USE THE MONEY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT
16 TO SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION TO STUDY AND DEVELOP
17 APPLICATIONS OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE THAT PREDICT, MITIGATE, OR

1 ASSIST IN FIGHTING WILDFIRES, INCLUDING, AT A MINIMUM, APPLICATIONS

2 OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE WHICH PRODUCE DATA THAT CAN BE

3 INCORPORATED INTO MAPS DISPLAYING THE FOLLOWING:

(a) CLASSIFICATION OF VEGETATION AND WILDFIRE FUEL;

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5 (b) PREDICTIONS REGARDING WILDFIRE IGNITION POTENTIAL IN A

6 PARTICULAR AREA FOLLOWING OBSERVED LIGHTNING EVENTS;

(c) The perimeter of an ongoing wildfire; and

8 (d) PREDICTIONS REGARDING THE LOCATIONS AND AREA TO WHICH
9 AN ONGOING WILDFIRE MAY SPREAD.

10 (4) IN ORDER TO ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSES OUTLINED IN
11 SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION, THE DIVISION MAY CONTRACT WITH A
12 THIRD PARTY THAT, AT THE TIME OF CONTRACTING, HAS DEVELOPED
13 ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE TOOLS TO PREDICT, MITIGATE, OR ASSIST IN
14 FIGHTING WILDFIRES.

15 (5) THE DIVISION MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS, GRANTS,
16 AND DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE PURPOSES OF
17 SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION.

18 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 19 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 20 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except 21 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V 22 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this 23 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take 24 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 25 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 26 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
