## **BILL TOPIC:** "Youth Involvement To Review Educ Standards"

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH INVOLVEMENT IN THE 102 REVIEW OF THE STATE'S EDUCATION STANDARDS.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. **Colorado Youth Advisory Council Committee.** The bill creates several opportunities for youth to be involved in the review of the state's education standards, to be appointed as follows:

- 2 youth members to any existing or new review committee convened by the department of education;
- 2 youth members to the statutory history, culture, social

contributions, and civil government in education commission (commission);

- 2 youth members to any regional educator meetings; and
- 2 youth members to any review committees for local education providers.

In each instance, the appointing authority shall select the youth members, and, if applicable, one must be from an urban school and one must be from a rural school from nominations submitted by schools throughout the state.

The youth members will serve as voting members and be reappointed pursuant to the specific review committee's or commission's process. The department of education (department) may compensate youth members for actual expenses incurred with participation and, if appropriate, provide a stipend in an amount determined by the department.

The department shall promote the opportunities for youth involvement and request schools nominate youth to participate.

The bill broadens the language concerning recommendations from the review committees and the commission that the state board of education shall take into consideration in its 6-year review, revision, and readoption of the standards.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

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2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 24-1-104.1 as follows:

24-1-104.1. State education standards review - review committees convened by department of education - youth participation. By September 1, 2023, and by each September 1 thereafter, the commissioner of education shall appoint two voting youth members from nominations submitted by schools throughout the state to participate in any existing or new committee convened by the department of education with the purpose of reviewing the state education standards and making recommendations to the state board of education for its consideration when performing its six-year review of the state's education standards pursuant to section 22-7-1005. Youth

11	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-1-104.3, amend
12	(2) introductory portion, (2)(b), and (3); and add (6) as follows:
13	22-1-104.3. History, culture, social contributions, and civil
14	government in education commission - established - membership -
15	duties. (2) The commission consists of sixteen EIGHTEEN members and,
16	to the extent practicable, must include persons from throughout the state
17	and persons with disabilities and must reflect the ethnic diversity of the
18	state. A majority of the commission members must have either classroom
19	experience or experience in developing education content standards. On
20	or before August 15, 2019, the appointing officials shall appoint
21	membership of the commission as follows:
22	(b) (I) The commissioner of education shall appoint two members
23	from the department of education, who are nonvoting members; and
24	(II) By September 1, 2023, and by each September 1
25	THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION SHALL APPOINT TWO
26	VOTING YOUTH MEMBERS FROM NOMINATIONS RECEIVED FROM SCHOOLS.
27	ONE YOUTH MEMBER MUST BE FROM AN URBAN SCHOOL AND ONE YOUTH

1 MEMBER MUST BE FROM A RURAL SCHOOL. THE DEPARTMENT OF 2 EDUCATION SHALL PROMOTE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUTH INVOLVEMENT 3 TO SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE STATE AND REQUEST SCHOOLS NOMINATE 4 YOUTH FOR A POSITION ON THE COMMISSION. 5 (3) Commission members serve for terms of four years; except 6 that, of the members first appointed, two members appointed pursuant to 7 each of subsections (2)(a)(I), (2)(a)(II), and (2)(a)(III) of this section and 8 one member appointed pursuant to subsection (2)(a)(IV) of this section, 9 as designated by the governor, serve initial terms of two years, AND 10 YOUTH MEMBERS APPOINTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (2)(b)(II) OF THIS 11 SECTION SERVE A TWO-YEAR TERM, WITH REAPPOINTMENT MADE BY THE 12 APPOINTING AUTHORITY AS NECESSARY. The appointing officials shall fill 13 any vacancies on the commission for the remainder of any unexpired 14 term. 15 (6) THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL TAKE INTO 16 CONSIDERATION ANY RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMISSION WHEN 17 PERFORMING ITS SIX-YEAR REVIEW OF THE STATE'S EDUCATION 18 STANDARDS PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-1005 (6). 19 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1005, amend 20 (6)(a) as follows: 21 22-7-1005. Preschool through elementary and secondary 22 education - aligned standards - adoption - revisions. (6) (a) Pursuant 23 to subsection (6)(b) of this section, the state board shall review and adopt 24 any appropriate revisions to the preschool through elementary and 25 secondary education standards specified in this section. In adopting 26 revisions, the state board may add or delete one or more of the specific

instructional areas based on the needs of the state and changes in national

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1	and international academic expectations. In adopting revisions to the
2	standards pursuant to this subsection (6), the state board shall ensure that
3	the standards continue to meet the requirements specified in subsection
4	(3) of this section. In adopting revisions to the standards, related to
5	history and civics, the state board shall take into consideration any
6	recommendations provided by the history, culture, social contributions,
7	and civil government in education commission established in section
8	22-1-104.3.
9	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1011, amend
10	(2) introductory portion, (2)(c), and (2)(d); and add (2)(e) as follows:
11	22-7-1011. Regional educator meetings - purpose -
12	recommendations. (2) At a minimum, the commissioner and the
13	EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL INVITE the following persons shall be invited
14	to attend the regional educator meetings in each regional service area:
15	(c) The preschool, elementary, and secondary teachers, principals,
16	administrators, counselors, and other special services providers employed
17	by the local education providers located in the regional service area; and
18	(d) The postsecondary faculty, academic advisors, and
19	administrators employed by the state institutions of higher education and
20	local district colleges, if any, located in the regional service area; AND
21	(e) Two youth members out of nominations received from
22	SCHOOLS BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2023, AND BY EVERY SEPTEMBER 1
23	THEREAFTER. IF APPLICABLE, ONE YOUTH MEMBER MUST BE FROM AN
24	URBAN SCHOOL AND ONE YOUTH MEMBER MUST BE FROM A RURAL
25	SCHOOL. THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROMOTE THE
26	OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUTH INVOLVEMENT TO SCHOOLS THROUGHOUT THE
27	STATE AND REQUEST SCHOOLS NOMINATE YOUTH TO ATTEND REGIONAL

- EDUCATOR MEETINGS. YOUTH MEMBERS SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION
  BUT MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR ACTUAL AND REASONABLE EXPENSES
  INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES.
- SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-1013, amend 5 (5) as follows:

- elementary and secondary education standards adoption academic acceleration. (5) (a) On or before July 1, 2017, and on or before July 1 every six years thereafter, each local education provider shall review its preschool through elementary and secondary education standards and, taking into account any revisions to the state preschool through elementary and secondary education standards, shall revise and readopt its standards, if necessary, to ensure that they THE LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER'S STANDARDS continue to meet or exceed the state preschool through elementary and secondary education standards. The local education provider shall revise its curricula accordingly to ensure that the curricula continue to align with the local education provider's preschool through elementary and secondary education standards.
  - (b) As part of each local education provider's review, regardless of time frame, each local education provider shall select two youth to participate in the review out of nominations received from schools in the local education provider's range. If applicable, one youth member must be from an urban school and one youth member must be from a rural school. The department of education shall promote the opportunity for youth involvement to schools within the local education provider's range and request schools within the local education

6	SECTION 6. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
7	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
8	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
9	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
10	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
11	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
12	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
13	November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
14	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
