CATPA Grant Program §42-5-112 C.R.S.




- To provide grants to assist in improving and supporting automobile theft prevention programs or programs for the enforcement or prosecution of automobile theft crimes through statewide planning and coordination.
- Operates with an 11 member Board (9 appointed by the Governor) to solicit and review applications for grants.
- Is administered by the CSP CATPA Office composed of a Director, Grant Manager, Grant Specialist (finance), and Public Outreach Coordinator.
- Criteria for grant awards are based on §42-5-112(3) C.R.S. and 8 C.C.R. 1507-50 by authority of §42-5-112(3.f) C.R.S.
- Grant awards (1-3 years) are executed through a grant agreement, using the State Controller's grant agreement templates.
- Grantees are required to report quarterly (or monthly) metrics, and semi-annual and annual reporting narratives.

CATPA Grant Programs

Focus on statewide and multijurisdictional partnerships to address specialized services in assisting auto theft prevention, enforcement, training and prosecution. Primary attention is given to programs focused on multijurisdictional offenders using crime analysis to identify patterns and trends.

• Colorado Auto Theft Prevention Initiative

The Department requests an increase of \$7,915,323 General Fund and 10.1 FTE in FY 2023-24 and \$4,719,274 General Fund and 9.0 FTE in FY 2024-25 to augment the capacity of the Colorado Auto Theft Prevention Authority (CATPA) and the existing multi-jurisdictional task forces to combat auto theft.

• **CATPA Budget Companion Bill** - The bill will clarify CATPA's current statute can receive and distribute General Fund monies under their authority to help ensure that CATPA can continue their mission to help communities and law enforcement agencies combat auto theft and additional criminal activity.



CATPA Board Review Process




The CATPA Board convenes annually for 2 days during a Funding Conference to review, evaluate and determine awarding to Applicants.

- Step 1: General Review of Application
- Step 2: Predicate Review of Applications
- Step 3: Application Evaluation & Scoring (Technical Capacity, Management Capacity & Past Performance)
- Step 4: Board Discussion to Develop Questions and/or Need for Applicant Interview
- Step 5: Board Interviews with Applicants for Clarifying Questions
- Step 6: Application Evaluation using Award Criteria Standards
- Step 7: Determining Funding Levels for ApplicantsFurther evaluation information can be found in 8 CCR 1507-50





CATPA Revenue, Grant Expenses and Spending Authority




- CATPA Cash Fund §42-5-112(4.a) C.R.S.

- Overtime Based Operations Unity of Command & Communications

Exemplar: BATTLE North and the Greeley Police Department along with eight (8) other agencies with two (2) multi-jurisdictional Colorado Organized Crime Control Act (COCCA) cases, with a prolific auto theft offender in both "The Endless Test Drive", and "No Keys, No Problem" in 2022. The Weld County Grand Jury indicted six (6) individuals with the combined 352 felony charge counts of motor vehicle theft, forgery, COCCA, and multiple other serious crimes. These two (2) investigations collectively revealed 57 stolen vehicles, with losses of over half a million dollars.



Most-At-Risk Thefts - Top 10 in 2022

- The Chevrolet Silverado is the most at risk vehicle, with 1828 thefts in 2022.
- The Kia and Hyundai have six (6) of the top ten (10) make/model vehicles in 2022.

Motor Vehicle Theft Summary - 2022

Last Year 1 out of 54 households were victim to a vehicle theft 9 out of 10 stolen vehicles were recovered **Every Day 113** vehicles were stolen 15 other vehicles were attempted to be stolen

99% of the vehicle theft charges included secondary crimes related to the motor vehicle theft







Over 50% of Colorado stolen vehicles are recovered outside the municipality of the reported theft.







Motor Vehicle Theft Trends 2017 - 2022


Colorado's auto theft numbers were stable from 2017 through 2019, with 2019 showing a 3% decrease.

- Social restrictions were put into place for Coloradans and businesses in March 2020 due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. Auto theft numbers substantially increased after the restrictions went into effect.
- Auto thefts increased by 40% from 2019 to 2020, and a 31% increase from 2020 to 2021.
- In 2022, auto theft increased by 11.6%, however the pace of auto theft is slowing.
- Colorado consistently has higher than average recovery rates.




