#### **The Consent Decree**

**OCFMH Information Management Systems and Data Reporting** 

CDHS was sued in 2011 for failure to provide timely competency evaluations and restoration treatment.

SB19-223 was passed and funded the initial build for a custom database to meet minimum data reporting requirement of the Consent Decree.

This custom database was not prepared to handle the increased programs and resources created to serve the competency population.


Upgraded systems needed due to an exponential increase in competency orders, new and expanded programs, healthcare worker shortages affecting the hospitals.

Leveraging Technology for Seamless Human Services Delivery

Colorado counties have encountered challenges due to the lack of a singular statewide solution to support the standardization of business processes, data, and document management.

Our current paper-based processes are slower with paper documents regularly becoming lost. Some counties paper-based processes are slower than others and many can't easily collect performance metrics.


JAI seeks to move to paperless processes, improve business process reporting, and standardize business processes statewide to meet these challenges through leveraging data from CBMS, CHATS, TRAILS and ACSES.

Federal Partners have approved funding 75% of this request, pending state general fund approval. \$3.7M State General Fund (State), \$12.8M Federal Match, \$16.5M Total Funds (Year 1).
