

# CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET REQUEST

#### **Project Summary**

The Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE), is requesting a supplemental increase of \$1.3 million in federal and reappropriated funds for FY 2023-24.

### **Project Status**

CDLE first requested and received funding for the DVR Case Management project in FY 2023-24. This is a supplemental request to increase federal funds and reappointed funds for FY 2023-24 by an additional \$1.3 million. The department had initially intended on requesting a second

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phase of funding in FY 2024-25, but is now requesting the spending authority for the completion of this project as a supplemental.

### **Project Description**

Background. CDLE is requesting additional federal and reappropriated funds for the implementation of a commercial-off-the-shelf case management system for Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR). DVR provides assistance to individuals with disabilities in reaching employment goals and living independently.

The department anticipates that the new system will enable division staff to more efficiently manage all aspects of vocational rehabilitation service administration and tracking for clients while meeting all federal and state reporting requirements. For example, the system may provide tools for vocational rehabilitation counselors to manage each customer's case, such as to-do reminders, case notes, vendor management, communication, and budgeting.

The department states this funding will complete the project and cover all vendor costs including:

- product planning;
- system architecture and design;
- legacy system data migration;
- systems integration processes;
- training and documentation;
- data interface and development deliverables; and
- additional user-facing features and functionality.

Problem/Justification. The division's current case management system (AWARE) is over 10 years old and needs to be modernized to meet the current needs of division staff and clients. The current system does not allow for online collaboration or sharing capabilities, which would allow the department to provide better services to its clients. Additionally, the department hopes that a new system will increase access to virtual services and decrease the time for clients to be approved for assistance.

Procurement. The department states they follow the Colorado Procurement Code requirements for competitive, equitable, and fair purchasing.

IT Accessibility. The new system will allow for accessibility upgrades that will allow the department to meet requirements from <a href="House Bill 21-1110">House Bill 21-1110</a>.

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Change management. The selected vendor is required to include a change management plan and training materials.

#### **Project Schedule/Timeline**

IT Lifecycle. The department believes the new system will have a lifespan of 10 years.

#### **Additional Cost Information**

Cost Benefit Analysis. The department anticipates that the new system will save significant staff time required to complete critical functions and allow for improved business processes. These savings could amount to as much as \$2.0 million annually in staff time, according to the department. Additionally, according to the department, the five-year cost estimate for renewal of the current aging system is approximately \$3.3 million without any of the advantages that a new system would bring.

Cash funds. According to the department, the source of funds that the department is proposing to use for this project comes from revenues collected by DVR from the Colorado Department of Education and school districts, along with a federal match.
