CACFP serves
45,000 children
and adults daily
on average

CDPHE funds
over 2,100
CACFP facilities
and 39 local WIC
agencies

WIC serves approx. 83,500 women and children per month



# Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)

- USDA funded and regulated program
- Provides meal reimbursement to:
  - School age afterschool programs
  - Child care homes, centers, preschools
  - Adult day care programs
  - Homeless shelters
  - Head Start



# CACFP supports the goals of the DEC

- Preschool Development Grant, workgroup to increase access to quality nutrition and increase CACFP participation
- Data sharing
- Compliance monitoring alignment between CACFP and child care licensing



#### Colorado Special **Supplemental Nutrition Program for** Women, Infants, and Children (COWIC)

- USDA funded program
- Serves pregnant and breastfeeding women and children under age 5
- Free, healthy food
- Breastfeeding support
- Nutrition education
- Referrals to other care and services



#### WIC supports the goals of the DEC

#### Partnerships with Head Start in some communities

- Data sharing to reduce burden on families
- Co-location of WIC services within Head Start

State and local partnership with SNAP and Medicaid



## Looking ahead: WIC & CACFP support of DEC

- Staffing support for collaboration, integration, & alignment
- Communication with local WIC agencies & CACFP participants
- Monitor establishment of DEC operations and systems to identify opportunities for collaboration



#### Looking ahead: CDPHE support of DEC

- Education Cabinet Workgroup participation
- ECLC membership and participation
- Involvement in any legislatively mandated responsibilities of CDPHE
- Expertise and participation in DEC subcommittees and advisory groups on a number of public health-related issues
