140 Suite Style Beds – 4 rooms, 2 baths, dishwasher, sink, refrigerator with full kitchens & laundry facilities


Project Size: 48,000 square feet; 140 beds



### MPAC PHASE II ACADEMIC INSTRUCTION GOALS



- Address <u>life</u>, <u>health</u>, <u>& safety issues</u> in stage and orchestra pit – abandons orchestra pit, sloped floor and unsafe catwalk system
- Improve <u>accessibility</u> throughout
- Connect bldg. to <u>campus geo-exchange system</u> requires larger mechanical room
- Create <u>additional academic space</u> for theater facilities; CMU remains 20k sf short of recommended space after new theater construction. Phase II converts 8,951 sf of current performance space to academic uses: recording studio, two rehearsal studios, faculty teaching studios
- Addresses sub-standard acoustical isolation in music <u>teaching studios</u> (accreditation issue)





#### Where we're heading


On September 7, the CMU leadership team participated in a master plan visioning workshop. The direction that leaders provided in this workshop will guide the progress of our master plan.
