A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING ADDING STRESS DISORDERS TO THE LIST OF  
102 DEBILITATING MEDICAL CONDITIONS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE  
103 USE OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

Bill Summary

**Committee on Cost-benefit Analysis of Legalized Marijuana in Colorado.** The bill adds acute stress disorder and post-traumatic stress disorder to the list of debilitating medical conditions for the purposes of the use of medical marijuana.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-1.5-106, **add**  
3 (2)(a.7) as follows:

4           **25-1.5-106. Medical marijuana program - powers and duties**  
5 **of state health agency - rules - medical review board - medical**  
6 **marijuana program cash fund - created - repeal. (2) Definitions.** In  
7 addition to the definitions set forth in section 14 (1) of article XVIII of  
8 the state constitution, as used in this section, unless the context otherwise  
9 requires:

10           (a.7) "DEBILITATING MEDICAL CONDITION" ALSO MEANS ACUTE  
11 STRESS DISORDER OR POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER.

12           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
13 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
14 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
