A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MODIFICATION OF THE CLASS OF VEHICLES THAT ARE 102 SUBJECT TO REGULATION AS COMMERCIAL VEHICLES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Transportation Legislation Review Committee. The bill increases the minimum weight for classification of a vehicle as a commercial vehicle subject to the statutory and regulatory minimum standards for commercial vehicles from 10,001 pounds to 16,001 pounds. With respect to vehicles that would be classified as commercial vehicles but for the fact that they weigh between 10,001 and 16,000 pounds, the

chief of the Colorado state patrol is authorized to adopt rules that authorize the Colorado state patrol:

- To annually inspect such vehicles;
- To enforce with respect to such vehicles all requirements for the securing of loads that apply to commercial vehicles; and
- To enforce with respect to such vehicles all requirements relating to the use of coupling devices for commercial vehicles.
- Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-235, **amend**
- $3 \qquad (1)(a)(I) \text{ and } (4)(a) \text{ as follows:}$

- 42-4-235. Minimum standards for commercial vehicles motor carrier safety fund created definition rules. (1) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "Commercial vehicle" means:
 - (I) Any self-propelled or towed vehicle bearing an apportioned plate or having a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination rating of ten SIXTEEN thousand one pounds or more which vehicle THAT is used in commerce on the public highways of this state or is designed to transport sixteen or more passengers, including the driver, unless such THE vehicle is a school bus regulated pursuant to section 42-4-1904 or any vehicle that does not have a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one or more pounds and that is owned or operated by a school district so long as such THE school district does not receive remuneration for the use of such vehicle, not including reimbursement for the use of such vehicle;
 - (4) (a) (I) The chief of the Colorado state patrol shall adopt rules for the operation of all commercial vehicles AND, AS SPECIFIED IN

SUBSECTION (4)(a)(II) OF THIS SECTION, VEHICLES THAT WOULD BE COMMERCIAL VEHICLES BUT FOR THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE A MANUFACTURER'S GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING OR GROSS COMBINATION RATING OF TEN THOUSAND ONE POUNDS OR MORE BUT NOT MORE THAN SIXTEEN THOUSAND POUNDS. In adopting the rules, the chief shall use as general guidelines the standards contained in the current rules and regulations of the United States department of transportation relating to safety regulations, qualifications of drivers, driving of motor vehicles, parts and accessories, notification and reporting of accidents, hours of service of drivers, inspection, repair and maintenance of motor vehicles, financial responsibility, insurance, and employee safety and health standards; except that rules regarding financial responsibility and insurance do not apply to a commercial vehicle as defined in subsection (1) of this section that is also subject to regulation by the public utilities commission under article 10.1 of title 40. C.R.S. On and after September 1, 2003, all commercial vehicle safety inspections conducted to determine compliance with rules promulgated by the chief pursuant to this paragraph (a) shall MUST be performed by an enforcement official, as defined in section 42-20-103 (2), who has been certified by the commercial vehicle safety alliance, or any successor organization thereto, to perform level I inspections.
