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# Colorado Inactive Mine "AML" Reclamation Program



Addresses hazards and environmental problems associated with abandoned or inactive "legacy" mines.



Mine properties that operated prior to 1977 before reclamation laws were enacted.



### Summary of Colorado AML Sites

- Estimated over 23,000 Abandoned Mine Land sites throughout Colorado.
- Estimated 500 hard rock mine features causing measureable water quality degredation.
  - Approximately 230 of those are draining mines.
    - 47 addressed with active water treatment.
    - Remaining sites continue to potentially impact water quality.

### Pennsylvania Mine

- Project site located near Keystone, Summit County and is tributary to the Snake River.
- Collaborative Project between EPA, DRMS, USFS, CDPHE, USGS and Summit County Open Space.
- Project investigations began in 2012 with completion of remedy installation in 2017.
- Constructed 3 concrete bulkheads to control and reduce acid mine drainage into Peru Creek.
- Completed surface reclamation activities in 2015 to reduce storm related loading.
- Resulted in higher downstream pH, reduced metals load, >80% flow reduction from adit.
- DRMS total project costs: \$1.7 million.





# Suncup/Centennial Mine Project





- Project site located near Slick Rock, San Miguel County and is tributary to the Dolores River.
- Collaborative Project between DRMS,
   Freeport McMoRan, CWCB, CDPHE & BLM.
- Relocated and capped over 48,000 cyds of uranium mine waste.
- Re-graded and revegetated 12 acres.
- Resulted in reduced erosion and storm driven loading.
- Total project costs: \$540,268.02



### Watershed Group Partnerships

- DRMS provides technical assistance
  - Site investigation
  - Project design
  - Project implementation
- DRMS provides match funding (SevTax)
  - Capacity building
  - Project design and implementation







### Mixed Ownership Group

- Discussion and planning group implemented to address AML issues in Colorado.
- Collaborative prioritization of AML projects.
- Stakeholders include Federal, State and Local agencies along with NGO organizations.



# **Draining Mines Inventory**

- DRMS partnered with Water Quality Control Division (CDPHE) to survey and sample draining abandoned mines in 2016.
- 165 mine sites were surveyed and 145 were draining and sampled during visitation.
- Mines sampled in the study are less significant pollutant loaders than those being addressed through EPA Superfund Program.
- Data from study made publicly available.

#### Abandoned Mines Lands Data Hub

- Joint effort headed by CDPHE and CGS to provide a publicly available interactive map of AMLs in Colorado.
- Multiple Federal and State agencies provided information for the database.
- Database includes more than 50,000 records.
- Made publicly available.

# Department of Energy Inventory

- Over 1,500 Defense Related Uranium Mines (DRUMs) throughout Colorado.
- DRMS will be assisting DOE with inventory of many of those sites over the next 5 years.
- Inventory will consist of site surveys for physical and environmental hazards.





#### Law and Regulations

- Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act (SMCRA)
  - Reauthorization required in 2021.
  - House Bill HR1731 (RECLAIM Act)
- CFRCLA and Clean Water Act
  - Inhibits partial clean-ups; requires discharge permits; increased liability
- Good Sam Efforts
  - House Bill HR2937 (Community Reclamation Partnership Act)
- Hardrock Legislation
  - 1872 Mining Law Reform
  - National Hardrock Program similar to SMCRA
