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Summary of Legislation

The bill allows the owner of a water right to voluntarily file a Water Use Reduction Plan (plan) with the appropriate division engineer before the end of a year in which any water use reduction measures are first implemented and in which the nonuse of all or any part of that water right does not constitute abandonment of the water right. The plan must include, among other things, a description of the water right, the historical and current use of each water right and the water reduction measures that will be implemented. The end date of any plan may not be more than ten years after the start date. However, the owner of a water right may file for an extension for up to ten additional years.

State Expenditures

The bill increases state expenditures in Department of Natural Resources (DNR) by \$46,800 in FY 2024-25 only, paid from the General Fund.

Department of Natural Resources. The Division of Water Resources will contract with the Office of Information Technology to create an online form for water right holders to submit a plan to division engineers. The form will require 240 hours of work at an hourly rate of \$195.

Other Budget Impacts

General Fund reserve. Under current law, an amount equal to 15 percent of General Fund appropriations must be set aside in the General Fund statutory reserve. Based on this fiscal note, the bill is expected to increase the amount of General Fund held in reserve by the amounts shown in Table 1, decreasing the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.

State Appropriations

For FY 2024-25, the bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$46,800 to the Department of Natural Resources, to be fully reappropriated to the Office of Information Technology.
