The Council of State Governments West (CSG West) is a non-profit, non-partisan organization serving western state legislatures. Through a variety of programs and services offered to legislators and legislative staff, CSG West facilitates regional cooperation, exchange of information and strengthening of legislative institutions among its 13 member states.

CSG West is one of 4 regions of the Council of State Governments, the nation's largest nonpartisan organization serving all three branches of state elected and appointed officials. CSG's regional and national structure invites focused participation from members on a more intimate, regional level while also providing a national platform to exchange ideas and an opportunity to engage with state officials of all three branches of state government.





2023 HIGHLIGHTS COLORADO

Pursuant to Colorado Revised Statutes, CSG is a joint governmental agency of Colorado.

State dues, which are established by the bipartisan CSG National Executive Committee, enable the organization to deliver substantive programs and services to state officials across the country. State dues are leveraged with federal grants and support from private sector partners to offer forums, trainings, in-depth research, and technical assistance. CSG, through its regional and national offices, serves all members and staff of the Colorado General Assembly.

Colorado Senator Henry Toll founded CSG in 1933, and is the namesake of the distinguished Toll Fellowship.

This program, which is conducted in partnership with Colorado's El Pomar Foundation, is designed to assist legislators within their first four years of service in becoming effective leaders and strengthening their legislative institutions.
