



Two items that went down in price—



The Wireless Regulatory Framework

Congress enacted a national regulatory framework to oversee the commercial mobile wireless industry

Federal

 FCC's jurisdiction preempts states from regulating rates and entry for commercial wireless service

<u>State</u>

- State Legislatures
- State Attorneys General
- State Public Utility or Service Commissions
- State Broadband Offices


<u>Local</u>

 The Communications Act preserves local zoning authority, but there are limits to enable expeditious and efficient wireless deployment

Pro-Growth Infrastructure Deployment Policies to Meet Consumer Demands

Deployment of wireless infrastructure requires state and local predictability. Key approaches to do so include:

- Streamlining permitting, fees and colocation for small cells, macro towers
- Collaboration and encouragement for local policymakers to promote and expand wireless infrastructure deployment
- Promoting wireless infrastructure deployment on state lands in close collaboration with state officials

Support Pro-Growth Tax & Fee Structure

Wireless companies look to states that welcome investment in their networks through positive tax and fee policies, including:

- Modernizing tax exemptions for broadband equipment
 - Rural Broadband Equipment Fund
- Review various taxes and fees included on consumer bills
 - 9-1-1 Fee
