quality service to the state's veterans and their families; and **oversees** the operations of the Colorado Wing of the Civil Air Patrol in delivering aerospace education and emergency services.


DMVA Vision







Improve the grant execution rate for the Veterans Trust Fund (VTF) Grants by 2% by June 30, 2025.





Colorado Army National Guard's Readiness







Military Auxiliary Programs




- The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA) will increase Colorado youth participation in military auxiliary programs by 15% by July 1, 2027.

The DMVA will conduct fifty (50) outreach meetings/events with existing programs to assist with program growth by July 1, 2025.



Following the Governor's Executive Order 2020 175, the Department has implemented the following efforts:


- Continued training for employees and supervisors, including new training series this year from The Conflict Center

The Department of Military & Veterans Affairs maintains an average Siteimprove score of 93.8%, securing a shared #1 ranking among 21 state agencies.





Stimulus Funding Implementation (1/2)

- The Department has not created any new programs using stimulus funds but is using State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds or SLFRF to complete several construction and maintenance projects on our Readiness Centers (RC) totaling a little over \$1.4 million dollars including matching federal funds.
- The Department has executed \$672,738.17 or 97% of allocated funds. Unobligated funds were recouped to the Governor's Office at their request.
