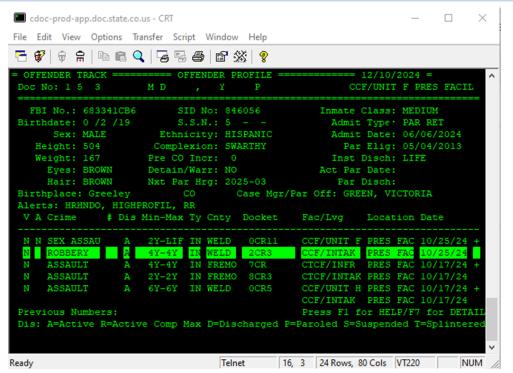

Project Request Summary



- The Department requests new general fund dollars in the amount of \$3,023,613 in FY 2025-26 in order to complete development and implementation of the DeCORuM project.
- This project is critical to the Department's technical debt remediation efforts and necessary to maintain critical data and processes.

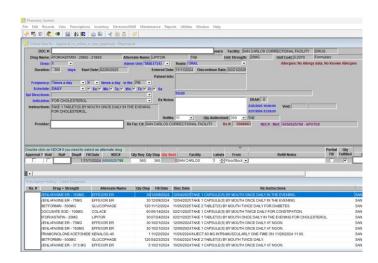
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Project History

- Project commenced in 2015
- Project Scope: Replacement of all offender related information systems
 - Phase 1: EHR and Pharmacy Integration
 - Phase 2: Offender Management Systems
 - Phase 3: Parole Management Systems
- The project was delayed due to issues with the vendor's ability to meet deliverable requirements for the pharmacy and EHR system and the pandemic

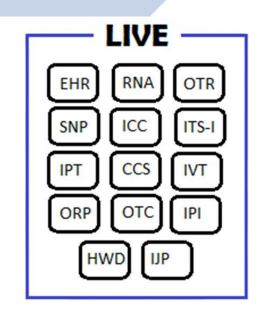
Pharmacy Impact

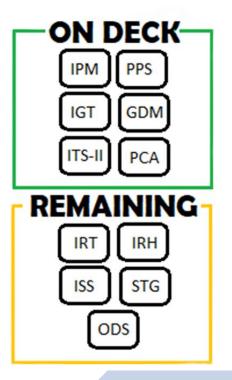
- Initial Pharmacy effort commenced in 2017
- Pharmacy development was subcontracted to a small custom software developer
 - No prior experience in the corrections pharmacy space
 - Very limited pool of developers in this industry space at the time
- 2+ years of work went into this phase before shelving in 2020 due to inability to meet regulatory and reporting requirements
- Department is looking to self-fund an integrated solution and will be submitting a no-cost supplemental



Mitigation & Current State

- Additional staffing resources from DOC, OIT, and vendor.
- Simultaneous implementation efforts for Phases II and III.
- Additional schedule review and contract monitoring.





Fiscal State

- To date, \$36,441,415 have been allocated to the project.
- Additional funds of approximately \$10M were requested for FY 2024-26, with \$6,140,514 authorized. At that time, the committee asked us to return for the third year of funding.
- Project will have approximately \$4,135,000 remaining funds at the conclusion of FY 2025 which will fund the remaining implementation of the system.
- The requested new funds are necessary to fund production support and maintenance of the live system while development concludes.
- Ongoing maintenance funds will be requested from the JBC for FY 2027 and beyond.
