Summary of Legislation

Status:

The bill requires courts to allow a defendant receiving hospitalization or intensive outpatient care for a behavioral health disorder to choose to participate remotely for non-trial criminal proceedings. Courts may require in-person attendance if they determine there is good cause.

the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems.

State Expenditures

The bill will increase workload for the trial courts in the Judicial Department for judicial officers to determine whether or not a person qualifies for remote participation. The number of criminal affected defendants is expected to be small and many courts currently allow for remote attendance in certain hearings by defendants. As a result, any additional workload is expected to be minimal.

Local Government

Workload will also increase in municipal courts for judicial officers to determine whether a defendant is eligible to choose to participate in proceedings remotely. Additional costs for software and equipment may also be required depending on the municipal court's current capacity for remote participation.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
