Summary Information

Overview. The bill requires various state agencies to recognize and enforce tribal court orders, arrest warrants, and civil commitment orders.

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires state courts, law enforcement, hospitals, behavioral health facilities, and health care providers to recognize and enforce tribal court orders, arrest warrants, and civil commitment orders.

State Expenditures

Starting in FY 2025-26, workload to various state agencies, like the Behavioral Health Administration, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, and other agencies that hire law enforcement officers will increase to update policies and coordinate with tribal governments. Workload to coordinate with tribal governments is assumed to be minimal; therefore, no appropriations are required.

Local Government

Similar to the state, workload to local law enforcement agencies, such as municipal police departments and sheriffs may increase to update policies and work with tribal governments. This increase in workload is assumed to be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
