

Homestead Exemption Definition




Homestead Exemption

A tool for property tax relief available to homeowners who own and occupy their property. Property taxes are reduced by exempting a portion of the value of the property from assessment. (Lincoln Institute of Land Policy)


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Homestead Exemption Availability

2024







General Homestead Exemption



Alabama

Homeowners are eligible for an exemption of \$4,000 of assessed value.



Louisiana

Homeowners are eligible for a \$7,500 exemption of a home's assessed value.



Oklahoma

Residents are eligible for a homestead exemption of \$1,000 of their properties assessed valuation.



Florida

Homeowners are exempt from property taxes up to an assessed value of \$25,000.




Homestead Exemptions for Senior Citizens and People With Disabilities



Georgia

Individuals 65 and older are eligible for a tax exemption of \$4,000 of their home's assessed value in Georgia.

Income Threshold: \$10,000



South Carolina

Homeowners 65 and older are eligible for a homestead exemption on the first \$50,000 in market value of their residence.

The applicant must have lived in the state for at least one year.

Illinois

In <u>Illinois</u>, people with disabilities are eligible for a homestead exemption of \$2,000 of the assessed value of their home.



Alabama

People with disabilities are eligible for a 100% exemption of assessed value from state, county, and city ad valorem taxes in Alabama.



Colorado Homestead Exemption for Senior Citizens

- Seniors 65 and older
- Must have owned their home for the past 10 years.
- Exemption amount is equal to 50% of the home's first \$200,000 in value
- Veterans with disabilities and their surviving spouses are eligible





How do Homestead Exemptions for Veterans vary across the states?

Homestead Exemptions for Veterans:

Connecticut

- 90 days of wartime service requirement
- Property cannot exceed \$305,000
- \$1,500 property tax exemption



Homestead Exemptions for Veterans:

Nevada

- Minimum 90 days of service
- \$2,000 tax exemption on their properties value.
- Tax exemption amount is adjusted annually.



Homestead Exemptions for Veterans:

Arkansas and Nebraska



- 100% homestead exemption for veterans with total and permanent disabilities.
- No income limits

Circuit Breakers


Circuit breakers provide tax relief to homeowners and can provide relief to renters as well. Circuit breakers work by refunding low-income individuals whose property tax liability is a significant portion of their income.

States set the income thresholds required for individuals to qualify.

Circuit breakers are offered in the form of credits on income taxes, rebates, and refunds.



States with Circuit Breaker Programs







Circuit Breaker Programs for Renters

Maryland: Renters Tax Credit

- 60 or over or 100% disabled who make up to \$73,000.
- People under 60 with income up to \$49,0000.
- Max credit is \$1,000.

Minnesota: Renters Property Tax Refund

- Renters who earn up to \$73,270 are eligible
- Maximum refund of \$2,570.

North Dakota: The Renters Refund

- People 65 and older, people with a permanent and total disability
- Eligible if 20% of annual rent exceeds 4% of their annual income.
- Max refund: \$400

D.C.: The Regular and Elderly Circuit Breaker

- Income tax credit equal to the amount that property taxes paid exceeds a percentage of household income
- For renters: 20% of rent paid.
- Credit is adjusted annually

Montana: The Elderly Homeowner and Renter Tax Credit

- People 62 and over
- Maximum income of \$45,000
- Eligible for credit up to \$1,150



2024 Proposed Property Tax Relief Legislation


Failed Proposals

- <u>Nebraska LB 1</u>: Adopt the Property Tax Growth Limitation Act, the School District Property Tax Relief Act, and the Advertising Services Tax Act and change revenue and taxation provisions
- <u>South Dakota SB 167</u>: An act to limit annual valuation increases on owner-occupied single-family dwellings.
- Wyoming HB 203: An act to provide a homestead exemption on the first \$200,000 of a homes value and impose a sales and use tax to provide for local government funding.

Enacted

- <u>Arkansas SB 3</u>: Increases the homestead property tax credit to \$500.
- GA HB 581: Limits the increases in property taxes annually.
- Kansas SB1: Increases the amount of residential property exempt from the statewide uniform school finance levy to \$75,000 of appraised value.
- <u>Nebraska LB34</u>: Political subdivisions property tax request could not exceed its property tax request authority and creates The School District Property Tax Relief Credit Fund.
- Wyoming SF0098: Increases the property tax exemption available to veterans from \$3,000 to \$6,000.
