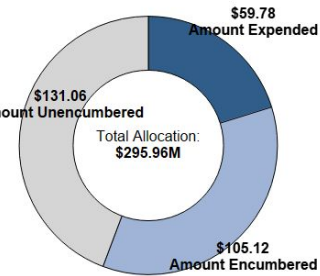

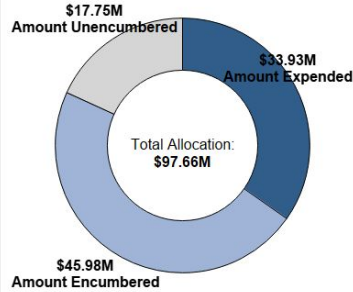


Overall Spending Status - BHA

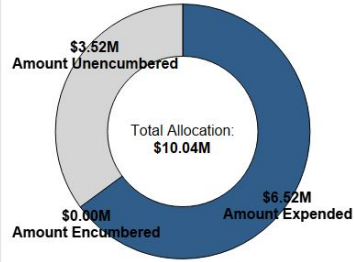
ARPA State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF)



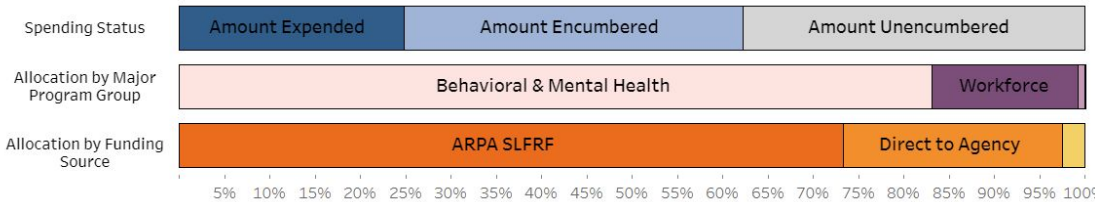
Direct to Agency Awards (DAA)



State Stimulus

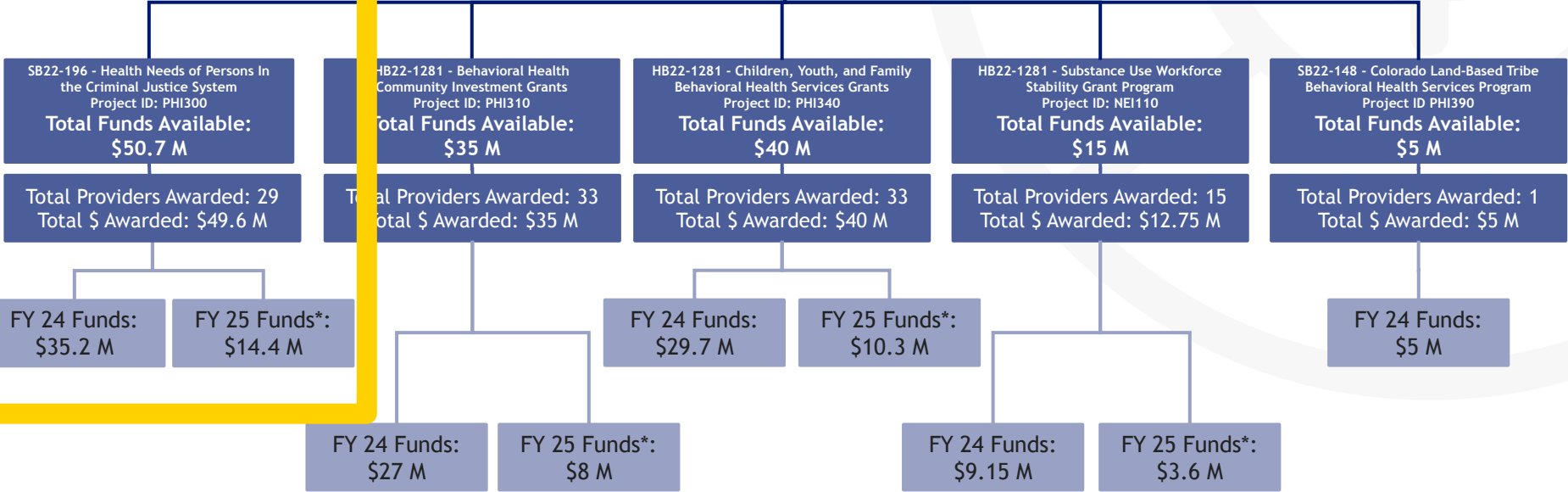


Stimulus Status

TOTAL: \$145.7 Million



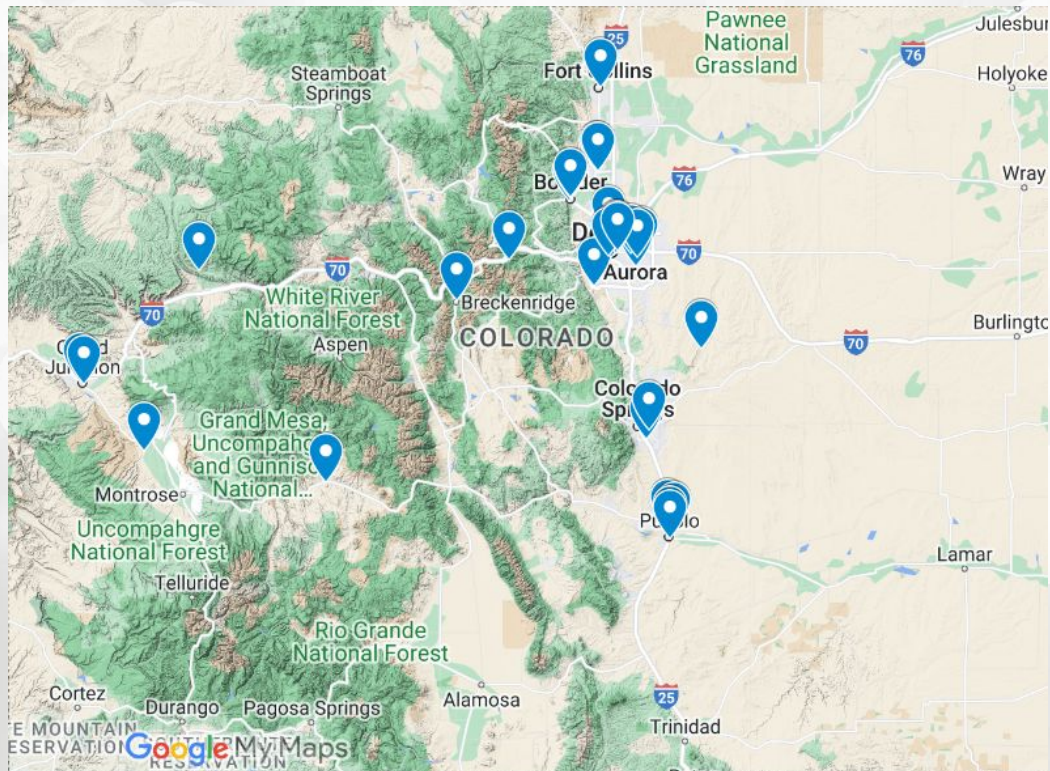


What type of programs does this grant include?

- **Early Intervention**- programs to prevent the onset of delinquent behavior and supports the development of youth's assets and resilience
- **Deflection**- pre-arrest programs that deflect individuals away from the criminal justice system and into behavioral health and social services
- **Diversion**- intervention programs that offer individuals who have entered the criminal justice system "off ramps" to by taking part in behavioral health or social services
- **Reentry**- behavioral health and social programs that support in the transition of justice-involved individuals moving from jails or prisons back to the community

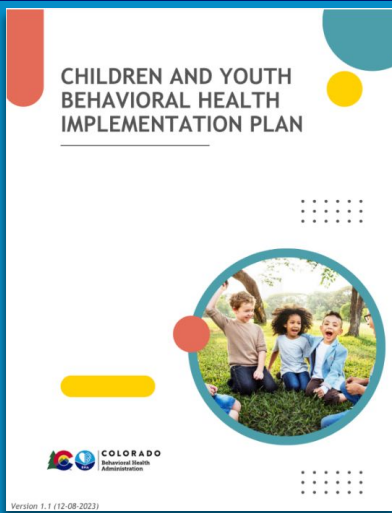

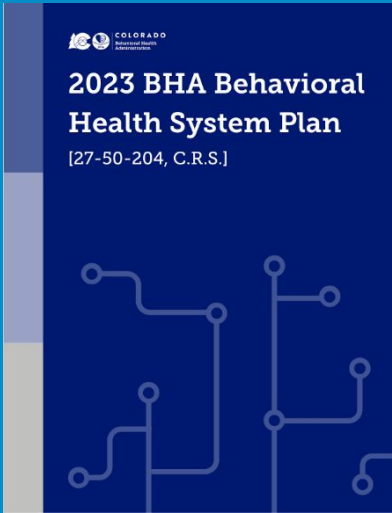
