Empowering Caregivers to Support the Social-Emotional Development and Mental Health of Infants & Children

Everyone has mental health, even babies!

Social emotional development begins at birth and is learned over time with support from adults.

Fostering strong mental health in infants and young children requires a caregiver who is there, aware, and cares.



When caregivers feel supported and confident, they are better able to:

- Develop relationships with children
- Teach social emotional skills
- Create a foundation for positive mental health
- Ensure school readiness




Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation Program

Free and voluntary support program that pairs a masters-level consultant with adults caring for children ages birth to 6-years who desire extra support to foster the social-emotional development and mental well-being of children in their care

- No cost, voluntary program supported by state and federal funds
- Prevention and promotion
- Partner with early childhood providers/caregivers to support the well-being of all children in their care
- Relationship-based, reflective practice
- Targets learning environments and programs, with tailored supports available for specific children
- Accessible to all adults caring for children birth (including prenatal) to 6-years, regardless
 of setting

ECMH Consultants

The state paid for less than half of the ECMH workforce in 2020-21. Stimulus funds (19%) and other dollars (41%) paid for the rest.



Who are they?

Mental health providers with deep expertise in early childhood, social-emotional development and mental health.

How many?


There are roughly **70 Full Time Equivalent** (FTE) consultants serving across the state of Colorado, **52 FTE** of which are state-funded.

Where do they serve?

The public-private partnership ensures coverage of ECMH consultation across **all 64 counties**.




State Contracted ECMH Consultation Sites



Note. Map indicates counties served by CDEC. Private, philanthropic, or otherwise funded efforts occurring throughout the State are not reflected on this map.





ECMH Partner Programs Served


Over half of ECMH consultants partner with the Colorado Preschool Program and Early Childhood Councils.






ECMH Workforce Demographics







ECMH Child Demographics










ECMH Consultation Program Reach Considerations

Barriers to Participation

- Voluntary, no cost program
- Partner with early childhood providers/caregivers. It is not about "fixing kids."
 - Time/Commitment costs
- Services are unknown or misunderstood
 - Stigma, concerns about early diagnosis or labeling
 - Reactive or compliance-driven engagement (e.g., permission to remove a child)

Efforts to increase high-quality, equitable statewide access

- Outreach & awareness including new communication materials
- Innovation: Online Referral, ECMH Support Line and Statewide Service Delivery
