

2019 in Review

- Began implementing updates to the READ Act
- Supported districts in implementing free full-day kindergarten
- Expanded the Colorado Preschool Program
- Refined and improved the new, streamlined school support grant process
- Continued accountability hearings and progress monitoring for schools and districts needing improvement


- Adjusted accountability frameworks for elementary and middle schools



By the end of third grade, all students can read at grade level.






CMAS English Language Arts Met/Exceeded Expectations 2015-2019








Future Teachers
