The chair called the meeting to order and welcomed fellow members of the task force.

3:30 P.M. – Discussion of Recommendations to Adjust Current Law

At the task force's meetings in December and February, task force members began a discussion of possible adjustments to current law. After this discussion, task force members circulated possible language for updates to educational use. The language proposed by the Colorado Association of School Executives (CASE) and the Colorado Association of School Boards (CASB) may be found here:

Task Force member Matt Cook and Mr. Brandon Shaffer, who presented to the task force in December, discussed the proposed language. Committee discussion ensued on personal identifiable information, student data privacy and consent by students and parents, clarity for retention and destruction timelines, and the collaboration between schools and law enforcement.

Discussion continued on object recognition, artificial intelligence, the ownership of data, and security and software systems in use by schools. Task Force member Michael Phibbs highlighted several issues related to institutions of higher education.

The task force determined to move forward with a possible bill draft requested possibly through the Joint Technology Committee on the topic of K-12 education.

The task force was in general consensus to look into expanding the scope of the task force to include artificial intelligence and possibly expand the task force membership.
