

Phase One - Recidivism Study Objectives

- 1. To provide a comprehensive analysis of post-treatment recidivism and desistance outcomes for both adults and juveniles under the purview of the SOMB Standards and Guidelines
 - Recidivism rates based on successful and unsuccessful discharge types.
 - Types of recidivism reflected in charge and conviction data.
 - Various client demographics.
- 2. To evaluate and refine the process to develop a robust research methodology that will enable these analyses to be conducted at regular intervals in the future



Defining Recidivism

Recidivism Event: Any new misdemeanor or felony charge or conviction for an offense (new charge or conviction) that occurred after a client's discharge date from sex offense-specific treatment through September 23, 2024


Any Recidivism: All new misdemeanor or felony offenses (excludes petty and misdemeanor traffic offenses)

Violent Recidivism: Any new offense that involves the threat of force or results in injury against a person (C.R.S §18-1.3-406(2)

Sexual Recidivism: Any new sexual offense falling within the purview of the SOMB (C.R.S §16-11.7-102(3)



Results: Cumulative Recidivism Rates Across all Discharge Types for Sexual, Violent, and Any Recidivism Among Adult Community Clients with 3-Year Follow-Up Time Frames (Count 308)

About two-thirds

Results: Recidivism Following Successful Treatment Discharge

Key Takeaways:

- Adult Community Clients: sexual recidivism rates remained low over three year follow-up period among adult community clients with successful treatment discharges
- Adult DOC clients: only a single individual had a sexual reoffense following successful treatment discharge
- Juvenile clients: there were no instances of sexual recidivism detected after successful treatment completion across the follow-up time periods

| Recidivism Type | Charges | Convictions |
|---------------------|---------|-------------|
| Sexual Recidivism | 1.1% | 0% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 4.3% | 3.3% |
| Any Recidivism | 13.0% | 9.8% |

Results: Recidivism Following Unsuccessful Treatment Discharge

Key Takeaways:

- Adult Community Clients: A greater proportion of adult community clients recidivated after unsuccessful discharge from treatment than successful discharge (e.g., 2.5% vs. 0.3% for One-Year Follow-Up), although rates remain low
- Adult DOC clients: No sexual recidivism was detected for adult DOC clients with unsuccessful discharge
- **Juvenile clients:** Not presented due to small sample size (less than five cases)

|---------------------|---------|-------------|
| Sexual Recidivism | 3.4% | 2.6% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 13.9% | 7.9% |
| Any Recidivism | 38.2% | 27.0% |

Adult Com. - Within 3 Years of Tx. Discharge (Count 151)

| Recidivism Type | Charges | Convictions |
|---------------------|---------|-------------|
| Sexual Recidivism | 3.3% | 2.6% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 17.2% | 9.9% |
| Any Recidivism | 43.7% | 31.8% |

| Sexual Recidivism | 1.1% | 0% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 4.3% | 3.3% |
| Any Recidivism | 13.0% | 9.8% |

Unsuccessful Discharge:

Within 1 Year of Tx. Discharge (Count 365)

| Recidivism Type | Charges | Convictions |
|---------------------|---------|-------------|
| Sexual Recidivism | 2.5% | 1.9% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 12.6% | 6.3% |
| Any Recidivism | 33.4% | 21.9% |

Within 3 Years of Tx. Discharge (Count 151)

| Recidivism Type | Charges | Convictions |
|---------------------|---------|-------------|
| Sexual Recidivism | 3.3% | 2.6% |
| Violent* Recidivism | 17.2% | 9.9% |
| Any Recidivism | 43.7% | 31.8% |
