



SYNOPSIS OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO STATUTE

Executive Summary

The Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT) is seeking to modify certain statutory citations to reflect the current information technology environment.

OVERALL GOALS:

- New vision of technology in the state
- Clean up, modernize, remove certain time bound requirements
- Match evolving role of technology in government with clarity on the original intention of OITs role in providing IT services and overseeing IT resources and staff
- Remove operating strategy policies and procedures that are administrative and not legislative

The three statutes we seek to modify are:

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

TITLE 24 ARTICLE 33.5

24-33.5-1902 Colorado cybersecurity council

- Add representation from counties and municipal government
- Updating membership to be more modern and supportive of the states cyber goals
- Allow the council to work with CBI, FBI, and other law enforcement agencies



SYNOPSIS OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO STATUTE

TITLE 24 ARTICLE 37.5

Part 1 - Office Created

- Updates definitions to align with best practices and industry standards
- Remove transfer language because it is time bound and outdated
- Clarify and modernize OIT Responsibilities
- Add language clarifying agency responsibilities
- Add authority for CIO to delegate responsibility to other agencies

Part 4 - Information Security

- Update cybersecurity terminology
- Remove cyber cryptology coding language

Part 6 - General Government Computer Center (GGCC)

- Modernize name to State Operated Data Centers and Information Technology Infrastructure

Part 7 - Interdepartmental Data Protocol

- Clarify OIT roles in data sharing and privacy for all state agencies
- Ensure statute clearly protects personal identifying information (PII)
- Identifies plan for statewide data interoperability plan and funding

Part 8 - Reports to General Assembly

- Remove reports due in previous years

TITLE 24 ARTICLE 85

24.85- Information Technology Access for Individuals who are Blind or Visually Impaired

- Update language to be more inclusive to *all* individuals in need of assistive or adaptive technologies
