



LOST RESOURCES:

Senior bus trips for recreational and social purposes are no longer funded. Between July 1, 2018 and June 30, 2019, bus accounted for 294 services for 70 clients.

Transportation Resources & Funding



▶ BUSTANG

Provides service from Fairplay to Denver

One trip daily Monday through Friday

From July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019

225 riders from Fairplay to Denver



▶ SUMMIT STAGE

Provides service from Fairplay to Breckenridge

Depart daily from Fairplay at 6:45 and 7:45 AM

Return from Breckenridge daily at 5:15 and 6:15PM

Winter schedule beginning November 24th adds a mid-day trip

Fare is \$2 each way

Average of 18 riders per day

Reimbursement Rates

Rocky Mountain Rural Health

- ▶ Reimbursement rate of \$0.38 per mile for both The Summit Foundation grants and the Community Assistance Fund

Park County Senior Coalition

- ▶ Reimbursement rate of \$0.53 per mile

Mountain Ride Transportation Resource Center

- └ Reimbursement rate of \$0.38 per mile for Medicaid NEMT benefit


- ▶ **RAE reimbursement** - RMRH guides Medicaid clients in the use of their NEMT benefit

- ▶ Mountain Ride Transportation Resource Center is the regional broker for Medicaid NEMT reimbursement
- ▶ Provides rides to medical appointments (when drivers are available)
- ▶ Provides mileage reimbursement to Medicaid subscribers for trips to medical appointments



189,761 miles = \$72,109.18
- ▶ July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019:
224,175 miles = \$85,186.50



- ▶ Park County Senior Coalition has been serving the senior population of Park County since 1977.







2015 Transportation Study

In 2015 the Park County Senior Coalition, the Park County Department of Human Services and Rocky Mountain Rural Health joined together to determine transportation needs in Park County.

PURPOSE: To determine the transportation needs of the Park County community.

APPROACH: Through the participating organizations, residents were offered the choice of receiving reimbursement for miles to medical appointments or getting a ride through a volunteer program.

METHOD: Promoting the project was completed by RMRH through outreach events and cold calls.

DETERMINATION: It was determined that most residents preferred to take their own vehicle and receive mileage reimbursement for their trips.

IMPACT


From July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019, resources available to Park County residents have reimbursed **360,156 miles of travel** enabling residents access to basic necessities of life such as healthcare and food.

But the need exceeds our resources!

To date, Park County Senior Coalition and Rocky Mountain Rural Health have been **UNABLE** to reimburse **47,553 miles** due to funding limitations.



Central Peaks



60 organizations in the Central Peaks Region received **103 grants** totaling **\$1,480,027** in 2015. This accounted for **0.5%** of reported foundation giving in Colorado.
