SCAO does not track the inquiries made of the office and receives a substantial number of inquiries daily through a variety of communication sources. This issue is only magnified when considering the number of inquiries made daily statewide in the Colorado Judicial Department to courts and probation across 22 judicial districts, over 70 locations and approximately 4,000 employees.
