




Standardizing Quality Virtual Hearings

- Upgrading technology in every courtroom
- •A committee studying how we might standardize practices
- Exploring livestreaming, starting with criminal proceedings
- Exploring statewide standards for virtual participation in court business

Covid Continuance

- ■HB21-1309
- Allowed courts to delay criminal trials, up to 6 months out of custody, 3 months in-custody
- Courts could use these through April 2022
- •262 continuances ordered statewide
 - 143 of those were misdemeanor

Court user survey

- Revamping program
- Pilot program suggests we will receive five times as many responses annually as we used to get pre-COVID in the previous Access and Fairness survey
- ■The pilot locations averaged a 4 out of 5 rating on both procedural fairness and service quality measures.
- ■72% of respondents said they trust or somewhat trust the courts to handle business they may have in the future



Adult post-release recidivism 5.9%


Juvenile post-release recidivism 8%

FY24 Budget Request



Staff salaries

- Support the 5% salary increase
- Trial court staff experience a 20% turnover rate in FY22
- Shortages cause employees to work longer hours, increasing the chance of exhaustion and burnout
- Turnover increases demands on training staff



Human Resources

- Human resources staff operating at 75% staffing level
- Budget request would request coverage for each analyst from 667 employees to 444 employees
- •\$640,145, 6.0 FTE



Workplace Culture Initiative

- Modernizing HR
- Organizational ombuds
- IDEA focus
- Overhaul training programs
- Request begins in FY23, in FY24: \$722K, 7.0 FTE

Organizational Ombuds

Modeled after International Association of Ombuds Standards of Practice and Code of Ethics

Independent, Confidential, Impartial, Informal

A charter will define the position

Similar to organizational ombuds at CU, CSU, and DPS

Bolsters formal reporting systems

Improves employee satisfaction

Some critical issues need to be worked out

Contract interpreter rate increase

- Nearly 82,000 events with language access last year
- Nearly 76,000 of those events were Spanish
- •Competition for interpreters growing with emergence of virtual work in various industries
- •\$10 per hour increase
- •\$396K increase in FY23



Judicial Education

- Expanding our judicial education unit
- 2.0 FTE, \$210,00 in cash funds
- education for judges is essential for the judicial system to perform and uphold public trust and confidence



Judicial Education

 "To preserve judicial independence, the judiciary and judicial training institutions should be responsible for the design, content, and delivery of judicial training."

 The International Organization for Judicial Training



Weekend hearings

- •HB21-1280 requires hearing for defendants within 48 hours of arrest
- Successfully launched on schedule
- Caseload requires a third bond hearing officer location
- •\$166K, 1.5 FTE in FY23, annualizes to \$439K, 5.8 FTE in FY24

Licensed Legal Paraprofessionals

Licensed Legal Paraprofessionals

Improves access to justice

Court is considering a rule that would create low-cost professional help for parties in divorce and child support matters

Roughly three-quarters of parties in domestic cases do not have attorneys

Conforming statutory changes are needed


Bridges program independence

Report provided to JBC developed in collaboration with stakeholders

Recommends the court liaison program, also known as Bridges, should be an independent agency

Bridges staff advocate for the best interests of the mental health of defendants

Other issues



23rd Judicial District

- •HB20-1026
- •Splits the 18th JD into two districts in 2025
- Arapahoe will remain the 18th JD
- Douglas, Elbert and Lincoln become the 23rd JD
- Four counties identified costs, included as part of our budget submission

Racial bias in jury selection

Criminal Rules Committee vote 8-4 to submit new proposal to amend Rule 24

Deadline for comments January 25

Deadline to sign-up for public hearing, January 31

Public hearing at Supreme Court courtroom February 7 at 3:30 p.m.

SB22-099 Record sealing

HB21-1214 established a process requiring SCAO to automatically sealing records for drug convictions

SB22-099 expanded the records that are eligible for sealing under the process established in 2021

The process will require SCAO to begin sending records to DAs in Feb. 2024 to review before records automatically seal

SCAO has begun planning and meeting with CDAC and is on schedule to comply
