- A vibrant regional economy


WAY TO GO



Way to Go is a partnership between the **Denver Regional Council of Governments** and **eight metro-area transportation management associations**.

- Goals: Reduce traffic congestion and improve air quality.
- Funded primarily through federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality dollars.
- The Way to Go partnership has been managing a voluntary effort in the region for more than a decade.

TACTICS



- Employer outreach.
- Community outreach and commuter trip planning.
- Advertising and promotional campaigns.
- Events and focused campaigns.
 - Bike to Work Day and Winter Bike to Work Day.
 - Go-Tober Company and Commuter Challenge.
 - Monthly Challenges.
- Foundational resources
 - MyWayToGo.org trip planning and tracking application.
 - Guaranteed Ride Home.
 - Commute with Enterprise Vanpool partnership

SUCCESSES



Way to Go's voluntary program has led to key successes:

- Second-largest Bike to Work Day in the country (30,000 participants pre-pandemic).
- Schoolpool maps provided to 12,800 families at 133 schools last year.
- Workers in Colorado telework at a rate 7% greater than the national average.
- In 2022, My Way to Go users:
 - Logged 624,966 non-solo driving trips.
 - Reduced over 7 million vehicle miles traveled.
 - Eliminated nearly 370,000 tons of CO2 emissions.

INFRASTRUCTURE FOR ETRP



In 2020, we began enhancing the **My Way to Go** platform for employers who want use **trip reduction** and **commute support** to recruit, **retain and assist their employees**.

The portal provides employers with:

- Data visualizations of employer and employee survey results.
- A trip reduction plan developed by Way to Go.
- Information on what commute modes employees are using.



COLORADO CLIMATE ACTION PLAN



DRCOG and partners began **gathering information** about Employer Trip Reduction Programs throughout the country in 2018.

In 2019, the Colorado Legislature passed HB19-1261, the Climate Action Plan to Reduce Pollution.

In 2021, AQCC issued a **notice of rulemaking** to revise Regulation 22 for a new Employee Traffic Reduction Program (ETRP) as part of the state's efforts to reduce GHG emissions as directed by the plan.

RULEMAKING - MYTHS AND REALITIES



Efforts to prevent the Rulemaking focused on these areas of concern:

- Privacy concerns of both employees and employers.
- Cost of program administration and compliance.
- Overall economic concerns.
- Mandate to commuters.

WHAT WAS PROPOSED



The proposed rule just included these requirements:

- Only the region's **largest employers** would be required to participate (100+ or 250 or more employees).
- Employers would determine existing transportation benefits.
- Employees would be **surveyed** to identify commute reduction opportunities.
- Employers could select **two or more tactics** from a trip reduction recommendation.
- Annual, **program-level reporting** would be available through the My Way to Go platform.

OUTCOME



Way to Go continues its all-voluntary effort in the region:

- Outreach specialists continue to engage with employers.
- Denver-region employers can access the ETRP portal at no cost.
- Employers who opt to provide staff with trip reduction benefits can use the portal to view data and recommendations.
