15 Summary and Analysis of SCR24-003

16 What is the status of same-sex marriage in Colorado?

- 17 Same-sex marriage in Colorado is legal due to federal and state court rulings and federal
- 18 legislation. The U.S. Supreme Court and the Colorado Supreme Court have issued rulings
- 19 recognizing the marriage rights of same-sex couples and in 2022, the U.S. Congress passed
- 20 legislation making same-sex marriage legal under federal law.

21 What does this measure do?

- 22 In 2006, Colorado voters approved an amendment to Colorado's constitution stating that
- 23 only the union of one man or one woman is a valid or recognized marriage in Colorado.
- 24 SCR 24-003 repeals this language, which was rendered legally obsolete due the court rulings
- 25 and federal law.
