SUBJECT: Governor's April 4, 2014 Revised Proposition AA Marijuana Revenue

**Proposal** 

**DATE:** April 8, 2014

The Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) submitted a revised proposal for allocation of revenues as a result of the taxation of medical and retail marijuana pursuant to Amendment 64 and Proposition AA. The revised request scales back the Governor's request by \$20.2 million.

**Table 1** summarizes the original OSPB request, the revised OSPB request, and the JBC staff recommendation.

In the March 12, 2014, JBC Staff recommendation document, JBC Staff recommended that the Committee spend fiscal year revenues in the following fiscal year. Based on the decision the JBC makes on that recommendation, various other decisions may need to be made. **Table 2** reflects the Marijuana Cash Fund uncommitted balance for the various scenarios the JBC could choose.

- > Row 1 reflects the potential outcomes should the JBC choose to spend fiscal year revenues in the following fiscal year.
- Row 2 reflects the potential outcomes should the JBC choose to spend fiscal year revenues in the year they are received and choose to follow OLLS advice regarding TABOR impacts.
- Row 3 reflects the potential outcomes should the JBC choose to spend fiscal year revenues in the year they are received and choose <u>not</u> to follow OLLS advice regarding TABOR impacts.
