SUBJECT: Staff Supplemental Comeback for Judicial Department Concerning Courthouse

Capital and Infrastructure Maintenance

DATE: February 3, 2016

On January 12, 2016, the Committee approved a staff recommendation concerning the Judicial Department's supplemental request priority #1, "Courthouse Capital and Infrastructure Maintenance". **Staff requests that the Committee reconsider its previous action on this request, and instead approve the revised staff recommendation described below**. The revised recommendation reflects updated information from the Department concerning the timing of information technology-related components of three local courthouse facility projects.

Specifically, as detailed in the following table, staff now recommends making a larger reduction in cash fund appropriations from the Judicial Department Information Technology Cash Fund for FY 2015-16 to more accurately reflect planned expenditures.

The Department initially requested a \$1,901,000 decrease in the FY 2015-16 appropriation for Courthouse Capital and Infrastructure Maintenance to reflect the impact of several local courthouse facility projects that were completed early (in FY 2014-15) or have been delayed or cancelled by the counties involved. The Department also submitted a corresponding budget amendment to increase its FY 2016-17 request for this line item by \$1,461,000 (including \$1,370,000 General Fund and \$91,000 cash funds) to cover the State's share of costs related to local projects that counties have been delayed from FY 2015-16 to FY 2016-17. Staff recommended, and the Committee approved, the supplemental request.

Staff learned this morning that the information technology-related components of three delayed projects will also be delayed to FY 2016-17. The following table, prepared by and recently updated by the Department, lists the five delayed projects.

As indicated in the shaded cells, above, an additional \$408,000 in cash fund expenditures will be delayed to FY 2016-17. Staff has thus revised the recommendation to include an additional \$408,000 reduction in cash fund appropriations for FY 2015-16.

The remainder of the recommendation, which remains unchanged, concerns the requested elimination of FY 2015-16 funding for three projects that were either completed early (two projects in Summit and Gunnison counties) or have been cancelled by local authorities (a project in Archuleta county). These projects are detailed in the following table.
