department of higher education for the purpose of assessing possibilities for a consolidation of existing information technology functions and services with those information technology functions and services managed by the office. The office is required to complete this evaluation by November 1, 2024. If the evaluation shows that consolidation would be beneficial, the office shall create a proposed plan and accompanying budget for consolidating the information technology functions and services of the department of higher education with those information technology functions and services managed by the office. For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, \$280,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the office to implement the act.

! Transfer \$4 million to the hazardous substance response

25-16-104.6. Fund established - administration - revenue **sources - use.** (1) (a) There is hereby established in the state treasury the hazardous substance response fund. The fund is composed of money that the general assembly may choose to appropriate from the general fund, money derived from the fee imposed pursuant to section 25-16-104.5, and any interest derived therefrom; money recovered from responsible parties pursuant to the federal act or the OPA that is not generated by the state litigating as trustee for natural resources pursuant to section 25-16-104.7; money recovered through litigation by the state pursuant to the federal act or the OPA that is designated for future response cost; any money transferred to the fund pursuant to section 25-16-104.9 (2)(b) SECTION 25-16-104.9; and any other money derived from public or private sources that may be credited to the fund. Money in the fund shall be annually appropriated by the general assembly, subject to section 25-16-104, remains available for the purposes of this article ARTICLE 16, and does not revert to the general fund of the state at the end of any fiscal year. If the fund balance exceeds ten million dollars in any state fiscal year and the fund balance is not projected to fall below ten million dollars within twenty-four months, the department shall evaluate the need to reduce fees to bring the balance of the fund below ten million dollars, and shall

The bill appropriates \$6,520,092 to the department for the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of autism spectrum disorders under the children's basic health plan.

14	fund and \$2,594,169 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability
15	fee cash fund created in section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., which is
16	subject to the "(H)" notation as defined in the annual general
17	appropriation act for the same fiscal year. To implement this act, the
18	department may use this appropriation for the children's basic health plan
19	for the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of autism spectrum disorders
20	pursuant to section 10-16-104 (1.4)(b), C.R.S.
21	(2) For the 2024-25 state fiscal year, the general assembly
22	anticipates that the department of health care policy and financing will
23	receive \$12,108,742 in federal funds for the children's basic health plan

1	for the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of autism spectrum disorders
2	to implement this act. The appropriation in subsection (1) of this section
3	is based on the assumption that the department will receive this amount
4	of federal funds.
