SUBJECT:	Annual Salaries for Statewide Elected Officials

## Summary

This memorandum lists the annual salaries for the five statewide elected officials – Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, and State Treasurer — for the four-year term beginning January 11, 2023. It also outlines the method for calculating these salary amounts.

## Salary for Statewide Elected Officials and Calculation Method

Pursuant to Section 24-9-101, C.R.S., the salaries paid to the five statewide elected officials are set as a percentage of the salary paid to certain judicial officers. For example, the Governor is paid 66 percent of the salary paid to the Chief Justice of the Colorado Supreme Court. The relevant judicial officer, judicial salaries, and the proration amounts for the five statewide elected officials are shown in Table 1. The salary amounts are recalculated every four years based on changes to the salaries of the judicial officers.
