**SUBJECT:** Recent Wildfire Legislation

### **Summary**

This memorandum provides a brief overview of wildfire-related legislation from 2020 to 2024. It includes all staff-identified bills related to wildfire, including bills introduced by the Wildfire Matters Review Committee. Bills are organized by category and identify impacted state agencies. The memorandum also includes information on appropriations, transfers, and other associated costs of the legislation.

### **Categories of Wildfire Legislation**

Wildfire-related legislation can generally be divided into one of three categories based on the programs or activities addressed: preparedness, response, and mitigation. These categories include wildfire-related programs or activities as follows:

- **Preparedness**—a range of activities that lead to safe, efficient, and cost-effective fire prevention and management, including planning, coordination, mobilization, and community outreach.
- Response—resources and actions or support by personnel responding to a wildfire incident, including resources for responding personnel.
- **Mitigation**—activities intended to reduce the potential for unwanted impacts, including vegetation management, fuels treatment, forest management, and structure hardening.

Legislation may span multiple categories and involve several state agencies. Similarly, individual programs or activities might match more than one category.

Table 1 below shows the total number of bills by category, as well as the total costs of all bills in that category. This may include direct appropriations, transfers, and expenditures from continuously appropriated cash funds for all bills, even those that did not become law. Costs do not include expenditures from federal funds.

Table 2 shows the total number of bills by state agency. Note that several bills involve state enterprises, which are largely self-funded, government owned businesses created by the state. Additionally, the Colorado State Forest Service is represented as a distinct state agency; however, it is connected to both Colorado State University and the Department of Natural Resources.
