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DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES

Department Overview

The Department of Regulatory Agencies is responsible for consumer protection carried out through regulatory programs that license, establish standards, approve rates, investigate complaints, and conduct enforcement through 41 boards, commissions, and advisory committees across more than 50 professions, occupations, programs, and institutions. The Department is organized in the following 10 predominantly cash-funded divisions: (1) Executive Director's Office; (2) Banking; (3) Civil Rights; (4) Consumer Counsel; (5) Financial Services; (6) Insurance; (7) Public Utilities Commission; (8) Real Estate; (9) Professions and Occupations; and (10) Securities.

Request/Recommendation Descriptions

S1 Technical adjustment to letternote: The request includes an adjustment to a letternote in the FY 2015-16 Long Bill to insert a recently created cash fund. The request has a net \$0 budget impact and does not change the Department's spending authority. Staff recommends approval of this request.

JBC Staff initiated – Broadband Deployment Board line item: The staff initiated request includes the addition of the Broadband Deployment Board line item to the FY 2015-16 Long Bill. The new Broadband Deployment Board line item will show a \$200,000 cash funds appropriation with an (I) notation; pursuant to Section 40-15-509.5 (4) (a), C.R.S., these funds are considered continuously appropriated. Staff recommends approval of this request.

NPS Supplemental fleet vehicle request: The request includes a reduction of \$2,249 cash funds to the Vehicle Lease Payments line item. Staff recommends approval of this request.

1331 – S.B. 15-202 (Exclude Water Conditioning Appliance from Plumbing): The previously approved request will increase the Department's Division of Professions and Occupations appropriation by 1.9 FTE and \$134,644 cash funds in FY 2015-16 to fund program activities associated with the implementation of S.B. 15-202 (Exclude Water Conditioning Appliance from Plumbing).

JBC staff and the Department agree that this request is the result of a technical error.

Department Request: The Department requests a technical adjustment to insert a recently created cash fund into the Long Bill letternotes for FY 2015-16. This source notation is required in order to use appropriation as intended by appropriation and statute.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Committee approve this supplemental request.

Staff Analysis: The supplemental budget request is a technical adjustment to the source notation for letternote "a" for the Public Utilities Commission and does not affect the amount of line item appropriations. At the time the FY 2015-16 Long Bill (S.B. 15-234) was enacted, the Telecommunications Utility Fund, created in Section 40-2-114 (a), C.R.S., had not been created. The Fund was created by H.B. 15-1372 (P.U.C. Funding Cap Removal), which was signed into law on May 29, 2015, and is meant to support the telecommunications portion of the costs of regulating public utilities. Based on the fiscal note for H.B. 15-1372, the source notation should reflect approximately 15.0 percent of the Public Utilities Commission line items.

JBC staff and the Department agree that this request is the result of a technical error.

Department Request: The Department did not request the addition of the Broadband Deployment Board line item to the FY 2015-16 Long Bill. However, the Department is aware of and supports staff's recommendation.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Committee approve this supplemental request.

Staff Analysis: The supplemental budget request is a technical adjustment to add a new line item to the Department's Executive Director's Office and Administrative Services section of the FY 2015-16 Long Bill. The new Broadband Deployment Board line item will show a \$200,000

cash funds appropriation with an (I) notation; pursuant to Section 40-15-509.5 (4) (a), C.R.S., these funds are considered continuously appropriated. The Board is funded by the Broadband Fund, created in Section 40-15-509.5 (4) (a), C.R.S., which receives cash fund transfers, contingent on approval by the PUC, from the Colorado High Cost Support Mechanism (HCSM), created in Section 40-15-208 (2) (a) (I), C.R.S.

The addition of this new line item will provide Board funding transparency. The \$200,000 cash funds appropriated in FY 2015-16 to the Broadband Fund were transferred to the Fund on March 4, 2015 by direction of the Public Utilities Commission. These funds are being used to cover the direct and indirect costs of program start-up, pursuant to Section 40-15-509.5 (4) (b), C.R.S. The Department anticipates approximately \$2.6 million to be transferred from the HCSM to the Fund by the end of the current fiscal year (FY 2015-16). However, the transfer of these funds has not been approved and is not reflected in the supplemental request. The amount of future annual transfers is not currently known because it is dependent on the availability of funds and the discretion of the PUC.

Department Request: The Department requested an increase of 1.9 FTE and \$134,644 cash funds in FY 2015-16 to fund program activities associated with the implementation of S.B. 15-202 (Exclude Water Conditioning Appliance from Plumbing).

Summary: Statute requires that the Division of Professions and Occupations (DPO) regulate the plumbing industry through the State Plumbing Board (Article 58, Title 12, C.R.S.) S.B. 15-202 modified Article 58 to create three new categories of registered water conditioners: water conditioning contractors, water conditioning installers, and water conditioning principals. In order to implement the statutory modifications, the DPO must promulgate new rules, update its outreach materials, and update its registration program. The new registration categories become effective August 1, 2016, pursuant to Section 12-58-105 (4), (5), and (6) (a), C.R.S.

The General Assembly inadvertently enacted S.B. 15-202 (Exclude Water Conditioning Appliance from Plumbing) without the necessary appropriation clause to match the Legislative Council Staff State Revised Fiscal Impact dated May 6, 2015. The original bill and its accompanying fiscal note had omitted water conditioning professionals from registration requirements. On second reading in the House Committee on Local Government, the bill was amended by a strike-below that created three registration categories for water conditioning professionals. The committee then routed the bill to the House Committee of the Whole pursuant to the fiscal impact of the original fiscal note. When the bill reached the Senate for consideration of the House amendments, the bill was not sent to the Conference Committee for the attachment of an appropriations clause. Instead the Senate passed a Concurrence with House Amendments motion.

Committee Action: The Committee approved the Department's interim supplemental request on June 19, 2015.
