SUBJECT: REVISED Senate Amendments to the Long Bill

DATE: April 7, 2014

I forwarded a document to the Joint Budget Committee on April 4, 2014 that pertained to Senate Amendments. I made errors to the titles in that document. This memorandum corrects those errors.

The Senate passed HB 14-1336, the Long Bill, today on third reading. Attached is a table that provides summaries of the amendments the House made to the Long Bill. I have also included a note at the bottom of the table indicating the General Fund impacts as a result of amendments to HB 13-1342.
