Department Overview

The Secretary of State is one of five independently elected constitutional officers of the State. As the chief executive officer of the Department of State, the Secretary of State receives and makes available to the public a number of records that are mandated to be filed with the State. These filings include business entity filings, administrative rules of state agencies, and campaign finance disclosures. The Secretary of State is the State's chief election official, and the Department administers statutory and constitutional provisions that relate directly or indirectly to the conduct of elections in the State. In FY 2013-14, the Department was restructured into four divisions with primary responsibilities as follow:

ADMINISTRATION DIVISION: Provides general management and supervision of the Department, including finance and human resources.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES: Provides information technology support to the program divisions.

ELECTIONS DIVISION: Administers statutory and constitutional provisions for the conduct of elections for the State. This includes certifying the content to the ballot, publishing the abstract of vote totals, overseeing the verification of petitions for ballot issues, campaign finance filings, voting equipment certifications, requirements of the National Voter Registration Act and the Help America Vote Act, and maintaining the statewide voter registration system.

BUSINESS AND LICENSING DIVISION: Provides document filing, records management, information retrieval, and educational services; registers business names and organization, trade names and trademarks; files secured transaction records and notary applications; and makes these records available to the public. This Division also administers the lobbyist program, licenses entities involved in charitable bingo or raffle, registers charitable organizations, and publishes the Code of Colorado Regulations.

The Department is primarily funded by the Department of State Cash Fund, created in Section 24-21-104 (3) (b), C.R.S., which is funded by fees charged for business filings. The other funding source is the Federal Elections Assistance Fund, created in Section 1-1.5-106 (1) (a), C.R.S., which consists of moneys the State receives from the federal government from the Help America Vote Act (HAVA) and is continuously appropriated pursuant to Section 1-1.5-106 (2) (b), C.R.S.

DEPARTMENT REQUEST AND RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY

Executive Request

The Department of State requests an appropriation of \$21,993,272 cash funds and 137.2 FTE. Except for a small amount of funding from the Federal Elections Assistance Cash Fund (\$349,222), all funding for the Department is from the Department of State Cash Fund.

Staff Recommendation

The staff recommendation is summarized in the table below, followed by brief description of each item listed.

Issue Descriptions

Centrally appropriated line items: The recommendation shown includes adjustments to centrally appropriated line items for the following: state contributions for health, life, and dental benefits; merit pay; salary survey; short-term disability; supplemental state contributions to the

Public Employees' Retirement Association (PERA) pension fund; workers' compensation; administrative law judges; payment to risk management and property funds; vehicle lease payments; and leased space. *The staff recommendation is pending committee action*.

Indirect cost assessment: The recommendation includes a \$21,971 increase in cash funds that reflects an adjustment to the indirect cost assessment line as a result of the Statewide Indirect Cost Plan

JBC staff initiated adjustments to all discretionary line items: The recommendation includes a \$3.5 million decrease in cash funds to balance the appropriation plus the Department of State Cash Fund balance with estimated revenue for FY 2014-15.

Annualize prior year funding: The recommendation includes adjustments related to prior year legislation and budget actions.

Statewide IT common policy adjustments: The recommendation shown includes adjustments to line items appropriated for: purchase of services from the computer center; Colorado state network; management and administration of the Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT); and information technology security. *The staff recommendation is pending committee action.*

GENERAL NOTES ABOUT THIS PACKET

Department of State Cash Fund

Except for continuously appropriated HAVA funds, the Department is entirely funded by the Department of State Cash Fund, created in Section 24-21-104 (3) (b), C.R.S., which also requires the Department to adjust its fees so that revenue approximates direct and indirect costs. The Department has communicated that the Secretary of State will not be increasing fees other than penalty fees increased on November 1, 2013. On that basis, staff is recommending a budget for the Department that provides operations funding equal to projected revenue, with additional adjustments related to ensuring a cash fund balance that is not in deficit at the end of FY 2014-15.

The FY 2013-14 total appropriation is \$23.4 million, revenue is estimated by the Department at \$18.9 million, and the beginning fund balance for the fiscal year is reported as \$1.9 million. In the November 1 budget request schedule 9 cash fund report, the Department estimates expenditures for FY 2013-14 at \$20.2 million or \$3.2 million lower than appropriated, providing an estimated ending fund balance for the fiscal year of \$0.64 million. Staff estimates expenditures for FY 2013-14 at \$21.1 million due to supplemental increases and Department-estimated reductions for common policy and indirect cost assessment line items that are not discretionary. Staff's cash fund balance analysis projects that the fund may be in deficit by \$0.29 million at the end of FY 2013-14.

The Department's total request for FY 2014-15 is \$22.0 million. The Department estimates revenue of \$19.0 million and expenditures of \$19.5 million. Staff is recommending a budget of \$18.6 million in order to balance appropriations with estimated revenue, with an adjustment to ensure that the fund is not in deficit at the end of FY 2014-15. The recommended budget is 15.4 percent lower than requested, and is achieved through an additional 10.0 percent cut to all discretionary line items from Department estimated expenditures. The estimated FY 2014-15 ending fund balance is \$84,701; however the legal services rate and non-discretionary OIT and operating common policy billing amounts are pending and may be higher than requested and estimated.

Staff expects that the Department may request adjustments through the supplemental process to better achieve overall savings through budget-neutral, offsetting line item adjustments as necessary, as well as to request increases in spending authority if revenue is projected to increase relative to the baseline estimate at any time in FY 2014-15.

- Staff estimated amounts reflect Department estimated amounts with adjustments for approved FY 2013-14 supplementals and to reflect the full appropriated amounts for non-discretionary line items.
- Staff recommendation amounts reflect an additional 10.0 percent decrease from staff/Department estimated amounts for discretionary line items.

Expenditures for FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14 include expenditures for the use of outside counsel. [When a suit is brought against a state department or official that, for whatever reason, the Department of Law is unable to provide a defense, the Department may use its legal services appropriations to pay those costs.]

Staff communications with the Department of Law suggest that the need for legal services in FY 2014-15 may be higher because of the even-year election. Staff is recommending a reduced legal services appropriation equal to 6,645 hours, which is equivalent to the highest-use year in FY 2011-12.

Request: The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$648,307 cash funds for 7,118 legal services hours.

Recommendation: Staff recommends an appropriation sufficient to purchase 6,645 hours of legal services. Staff will calculate the actual appropriation when the Committee approves an hourly rate for legal services and reflect that appropriation in the Long Bill.

Administrative Law Judge Services

This line item is used to purchase administrative law services from the Department of Personnel.

Request: The Department is requesting an appropriation of \$31,216 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of common policy for this line item. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

Purchase of Services from Computer Center

This line item is used to reimburse the Governor's Office of Information Technology (OIT) for the Department's share of the state's computer system.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$95,106 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of common policy for this line item. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

Colorado State Network

Funds in this line are used to reimburse OIT for the Department's share of the statewide multiuse network.

Request: Department requests an appropriation of \$105,595 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of common policy for this line item. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

Payment to Risk Management and Property Funds

This line item is used to reimburse the Department of Personnel for the Department's share of the state's liability and property insurance.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$52,559 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of common policy for this line item. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

Vehicle Lease Payments

This line item provides funding for annual payments to the Department of Personnel for the cost of administration and lease-purchase payments for new and replacement vehicles. The Department currently operates one vehicle which is used primarily for statewide travel for elections officials. The vehicle is not slated for replacement in FY 2014-15.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$528 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of common policy for this line item. Staff will reflect Committee policy in the appropriation for this line item.

Leased Space

The line item funds the space the Department occupies at 1700 Broadway, Denver.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$658,026 cash funds. The request includes an annualization adjustment.

Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of the Department's request for an appropriation of \$658,026 cash funds from the Department of State Cash Fund.

COFRS Modernization

The line item provides funding for the Department's share of funding for the replacement of the statewide accounting system (COFRS) used by the Office of the State Controller to record all state revenues and expenditures.

Request: The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$40,140 cash funds.

Indirect Cost Assessment

Beginning this year, all statewide indirect cost recoveries will be used to offset General Fund in the Office of the Governor.

Recommendation: Pursuant to approved Committee policy, staff recommends an appropriation of \$128,983 cash funds from the Department of State Cash Fund.

Discretionary Fund

Pursuant to Section 24-9-105, C.R.S., each of five elected state officials receives an annual appropriation for "expenditure in pursuance of official business as each elected official sees fit". Subject to annual appropriation by the General Assembly, the Secretary of State receives an appropriation of \$5,000 cash funds for this purpose.

Request: The Department has requested a continuation appropriation of \$5,000 cash funds.

Help America Vote Program

Congress passed HAVA in 2002 for the purpose of improving the administration of federal elections. In 2003, the Colorado General Assembly passed the "Colorado Help America Vote Act" which included the creation of the Federal Elections Assistance Cash Fund to receive federal and state moneys appropriated for HAVA-related purposes (Section 1-1.5-106, C.R.S.). Appropriations from the Federal Elections Assistance Fund are continuously appropriated pursuant to Section 1-1.5-106 (2) (b), C.R.S., to the Department of State for the proper administration, implementation, and enforcement of the federal Help America Vote Act. The HAVA line item appropriation is a projection and included for informational purposes only.

Request: The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$349,222 cash funds from the Federal Elections Assistance Cash Fund.

Recommendation: Staff recommends reflecting an appropriation of \$1,000 cash funds. This line item is a continuous appropriation and is included for informational purposes only. The Department's request amount is not tied to planned or projected spending from this line item. Therefore staff recommends reflecting a minimal, placeholder amount.

Local Election Reimbursement

Section 1-5-505.5, C.R.S., requires the Secretary of State to reimburse counties for the costs related to having a statewide issue on the ballot. Pursuant to H.B. 12-1143, counties with fewer than 10,000 active voters are reimbursed at a rate of \$0.90 per active registered voter, and counties with more than 10,000 active registered voters are reimbursed at a rate of \$0.80 per active registered voter. Although H.B. 13-1303 did not increase the reimbursement rate, the bill increased the number of eligible voters by eliminating the inactive-failed to vote (I-FTV) status and shifted those voters to active status. As of October 1, 2013, there were just over 3.0 million active voters. The Department's supplemental appropriation for FY 2013-14 increased the appropriation to \$2.5 million.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$2,004,036 cash funds.

Recommendation: Staff recommends an appropriation of \$2,504,036 cash funds from the Department of State Cash Fund, equivalent to the FY 2013-14 total appropriation, as detailed in the following table.

Initiative and Referendum

This appropriation provides funding for petition verification, the activities of the Ballot Title Setting Board, and the cost of translating the ballot information booklet (the "Blue Book") into Spanish. Expenditures are primarily driven by the number of initiatives received during a given year, and they fluctuate because for odd-year elections, only TABOR-related initiatives are permitted on the November ballot. For even-year elections (presidential and gubernatorial election years), there are no restrictions on the types of initiatives, therefore even-year expenditures are higher. The JBC practice has been to appropriate \$150,000 cash funds in years with odd-year elections, and \$250,000 in years with even-year elections.

Request: The Department requests an appropriation of \$250,000 cash funds.

(4) Business and Licensing Division

This Division also administers the lobbyist program, licenses entities involved in charitable bingo or raffle, registers charitable organizations, and publishes the Code of Colorado Regulations.
