## SENATE COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE AMENDMENT

Committee on Health & Human Services.SB21-137 be amended as follows:

1 Amend printed bill, page 21, after line 15 insert:

2 "SECTION 19. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 24-33.5-117  
3 and 24-33.5-118 as follows:

4 **24-33.5-117. Dangerous drugs coordination council - creation**  
5 **- duties.** (1) THERE IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT THE DANGEROUS  
6 DRUGS COORDINATION COUNCIL, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE  
7 "COUNCIL", TO FACILITATE AND COORDINATE INFORMATION SHARING  
8 AMONG LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ACROSS THE STATE.

9 (2) THE COUNCIL CONSISTS OF FOURTEEN MEMBERS APPOINTED BY  
10 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AS FOLLOWS:

11 (a) ONE POLICE CHIEF WHO REPRESENTS A RURAL DISTRICT;  
12 (b) ONE POLICE CHIEF WHO REPRESENTS AN URBAN DISTRICT;  
13 (c) ONE SHERIFF WHO REPRESENTS A RURAL DISTRICT;  
14 (d) ONE SHERIFF WHO REPRESENTS AN URBAN DISTRICT;  
15 (e) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO DISTRICT  
16 ATTORNEY'S COUNCIL;

17 (f) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE OFFICE OF STATE PUBLIC  
18 DEFENDER;

19 (g) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO ATTORNEY  
20 GENERAL'S OFFICE;

21 (h) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE STATE CORONERS' ASSOCIATION;

22 (i) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO DRUG  
23 INVESTIGATORS ASSOCIATION;

24 (j) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE  
25 POLICY AND FINANCING;

26 (k) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH  
27 AND ENVIRONMENT;

28 (l) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY;

29 (m) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO BUREAU OF  
30 INVESTIGATION; AND

31 (n) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE COLORADO INFORMATION  
32 ANALYSIS CENTER.

33 (3) THE COUNCIL SHALL MEET QUARTERLY. THE COUNCIL HAS THE  
34 FOLLOWING DUTIES:

35 (a) TO COORDINATE STRATEGIC RESPONSES TO EMERGING ILLICIT  
36 DRUG TRENDS, REGARDLESS OF THE DRUG TYPE INVOLVED;

37 (b) TO SHARE DATA AND CASE INTELLIGENCE THAT PROMOTES  
38 PROACTIVE AND COLLABORATIVE RESPONSES TO DANGEROUS DRUG  
39 ISSUES;

40 (c) TO COORDINATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OVERDOSE

1 DETECTION MAPPING APPLICATION PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION  
2 24-33.5-118; AND

3 (d) TO FACILITATE COORDINATION AND COLLABORATION WITH  
4 FEDERAL PARTNERS AND STAKEHOLDERS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED  
5 TO, THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY'S OFFICE; HOMELAND SECURITY  
6 INVESTIGATIONS IN THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY;  
7 THE UNITED STATES POSTAL INSPECTION SERVICE; THE DRUG  
8 ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION IN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF  
9 JUSTICE; THE BUREAU OF ALCOHOL, TOBACCO, FIREARMS, AND EXPLOSIVES  
10 IN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE; THE FEDERAL BUREAU  
11 OF INVESTIGATION; AND THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH INTENSITY DRUG  
12 TRAFFICKING AREA.

13 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ONE STAFF PERSON TO  
14 COORDINATE THE COUNCIL'S MEETINGS AND PERFORM ANY ADDITIONAL  
15 ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES.

16 **24-33.5-118. Implementation of the overdose detection**  
17 **mapping application program.** (1) THE DANGEROUS DRUGS  
18 COORDINATION COUNCIL, CREATED IN SECTION 24-33.5-117 AND  
19 REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "COUNCIL", SHALL COORDINATE THE  
20 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OVERDOSE DETECTION MAPPING APPLICATION  
21 PROGRAM IN COLORADO, WHICH INCLUDES, AT A MINIMUM, OUTREACH TO  
22 RURAL PUBLIC HEALTH AND PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCIES AND FACILITATING  
23 STATEWIDE PARTICIPATION.

24 (2) THE COUNCIL SHALL REQUIRE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE  
25 PROVIDERS, CORONERS, LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, AND EMERGENCY  
26 DEPARTMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OVERDOSE DETECTION MAPPING  
27 APPLICATION PROGRAM."
