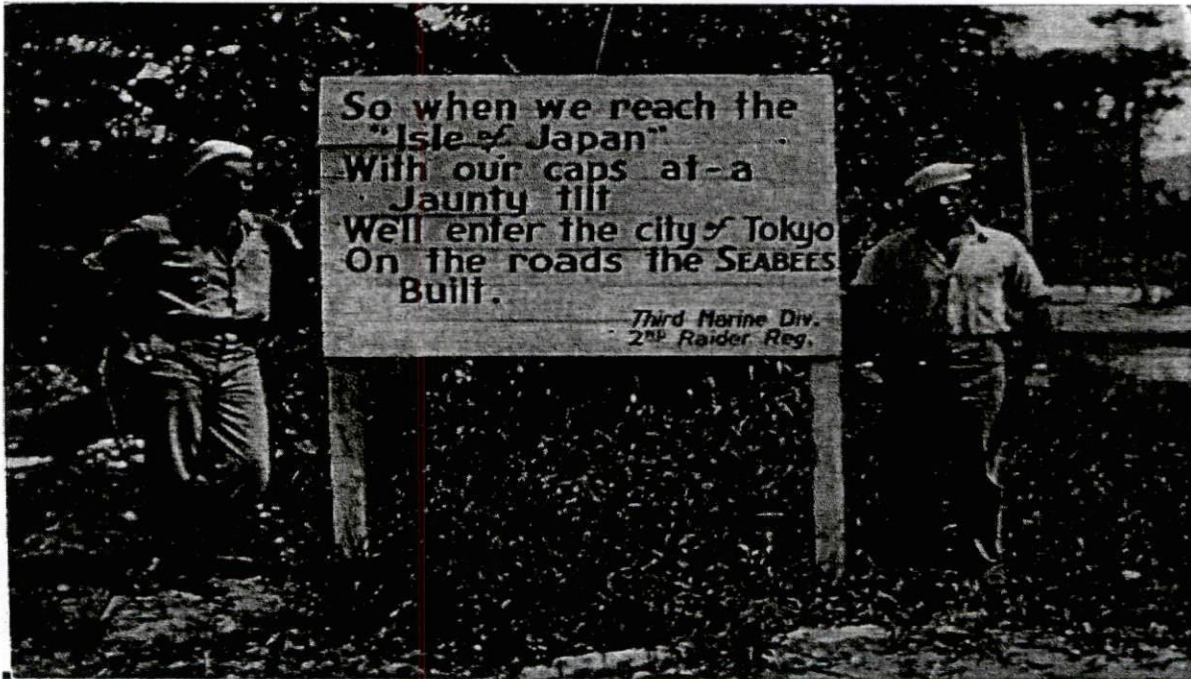

This popular rhyme was told by Marines and Seabees alike in preparation for the invasion of Japan.



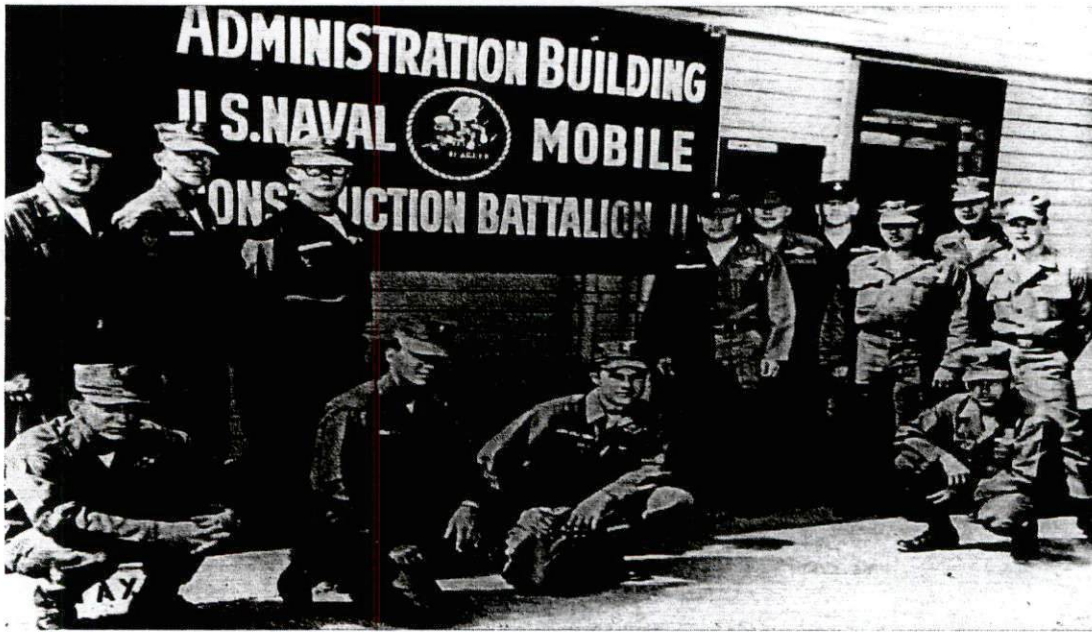
Once again, the Seabees were deployed first during the Korean War. In this photo the Seabees had landed at Inchon, Korea. Their mission was to set up a pier.



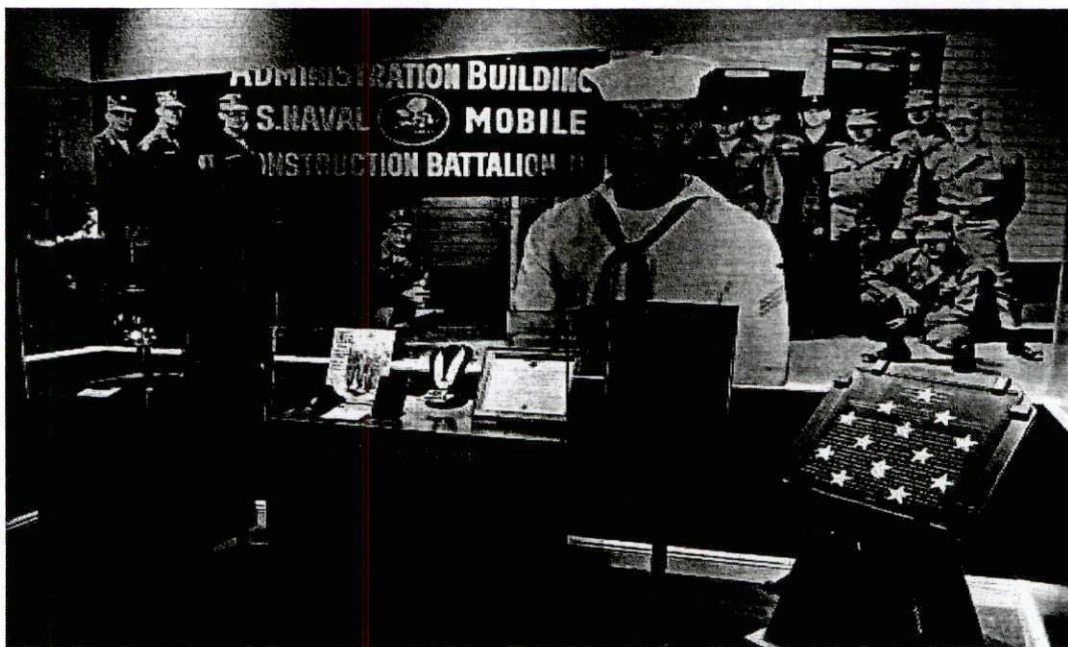

Seabees working in frigid conditions during Operation Deep Freeze.



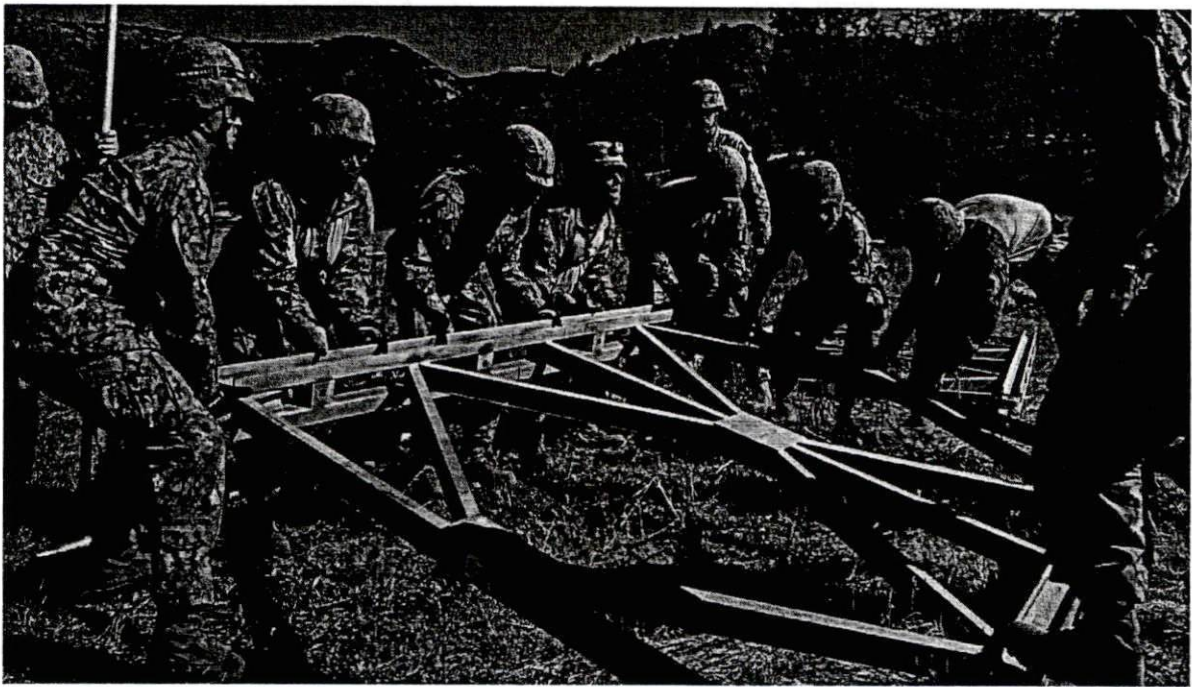
Seabees stationed in Vietnam. Among this group is Marvin G. Shields, a Medal of Honor recipient.



Marvin G. Shields was awarded the Medal of Honor. While working on the unfinished Special Forces camp at Dong Xoai, the Vietcong attacked. Shields helped bring ammunition to the front, carry wounded away, and assist in fighting the enemy force. He was wounded multiple times throughout the fight, but managed to save many lives thanks to his valiant actions. Shields was buried 10 days later. His wife was given the Medal of Honor during a ceremony at the White House.



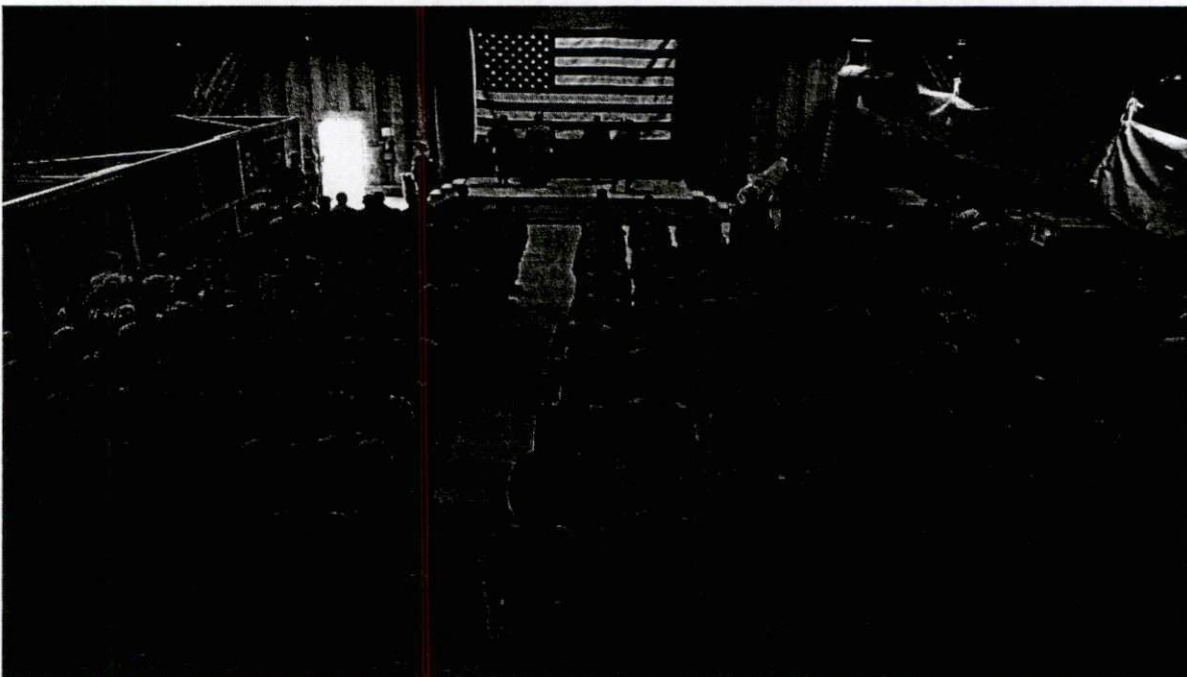
In Fallujah, Seabees worked to prepare the site for the construction of a bridge in 2006.
