

# House Bill 25-1024

## Medical-Aesthetic Services Delegation Disclosures

### What It Does

Provides transparency to consumers seeking medical-aesthetic services at medical spas by requiring these businesses to post a notice in a conspicuous place stating:

- Who the licensed professional delegating their authority to the business is
- Their license number
- Their contact information
- The website where consumers may file a complaint with the Department of Regulatory Agencies

Also requires consumers to sign a disclosure containing this same information

### Why This Is Important

- Medical Spas are increasingly popular
- Consumers often do not realize that they are receiving services from an unlicensed person who was delegated authority from a medical professional
- Consumers should know who the medical director delegating services is
- Bolsters transparency
- Allows patients to know where to turn if they are harmed



### Demonstrations of Harm

Sample of Complaints DORA has Received
Facial injuries from use of hot oil
Severe burns from use of laser devices
Bruising and other injuries from use of fillers
Unlicensed persons posing as doctors or other medical professionals

Barber/Cosmetology complaints received in FY 24 related to delegation issues (78/625)



Nursing complaints in FY24 related to the aesthetics industry, resulting in 22% of the cases referred for further investigation
