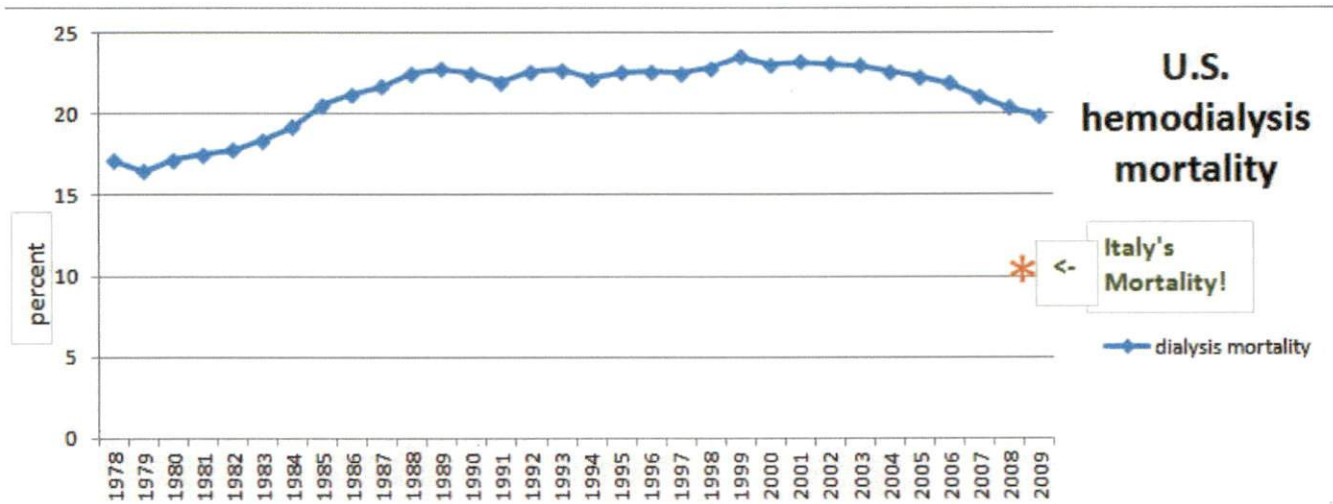


A THIRTY YEAR HISTORY OF KIDNEY DIALYSIS
