



Please **SUPPORT** SB 17-60

**Relocating the Colorado Student Leaders Institute from
Lt. Governor's Office to Department of Higher Education**

Bill Sponsors: Senator Nancy Todd and Representative Jim Wilson

SB 17-60 is part of the 2017 Legislative Agenda for the Colorado Department of Higher Education (DHE).

This technical bill simply relocates the administration of the Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI), created by 15-290, from the Lieutenant Governor's Office to DHE.

What is COSLI?

Colorado Student Leaders Institute, an affiliate of the National Conference of Governor's Schools, is an academic summer residential program for high school students who are working to become quality leaders and who promote and inspire a strong United States of America. COSLI seeks to reinforce the importance of civic engagement, entrepreneurship, responsibility, accountability, ethics and integrity in the rising generation of American leaders.

This is a **four-week summer residential immersion collegiate academic experience** intended to support and inspire students as they transition from higher school to the rigor and freedom offered of a college or university setting. Participants (1) **earn three hours of college credit**; (2) complete **two high school capstones**, including a Colorado centric National History Day Colorado project; and, (3) are **given a Colorado centric civic challenge** to be completed with the four week time period –creating and executing a business plan during the twenty-eight day program, donating a percentage of their profit to a Colorado non-profit; and the final reports are given to state and business leaders at the end of the session.

Why is this change needed?

- **DHE has the expertise** to oversee this program, the content of which dovetails with our key competencies and focus.
- This is a **technical change only**; no other aspect of the program or funding is being changed.
- **When originally established**, the Lieutenant Governor was also the Executive Director for Higher Education. This is no longer the case.
- The **Joint Budget Committee raised the question**, during the JBC hearings, of the appropriateness of this program being housed in the Lt. Governor's office and it was agreed that it should be moved.
