The Office of the State Auditor analyzed Colorado's conservation easement tax credit, and in a revealing report released last week found that in 16 years, the tax credit has cost the state almost \$1 billion.

Yes, it has put more than 1.7 million acres in permanent conservation status, meaning there are tight restrictions on how the land is used and developed in the future. It is intended to protect critical habitats for wild animals, endangered species and open spaces used for recreation or education.

But there is a problem here.

"No one in the state has bothered to evaluate whether what is being conserved is worth the lost tax revenue," the audit says.
