

## Testimony for Hearing on Monday, April 4, 2016

My name is John Hentges and I am the founder and president of Pro Se Alliance, a nonprofit organization that advocates for victims of injustice and teaches people how to represent themselves in legal matters.

I am also the proud father of five children in Jefferson County, who I haven't seen for nearly nine years due to corruption in Colorado's First Judicial District. We are victims of a "fixed" divorce, in which nearly everything I had from 25 years of backbreaking work – including my once happy family, my paid off home and business headquarters on 27 acres in Evergreen, my semi-retirement, my family's emerging business and all business assets, my premarital belongings, my inheritances, eight vehicles, and even many of my tools, equipment and other things that were only of use and value to me – was taken from me with the stroke of a corrupt judge's pen (judge Stephen Munsinger).

And then, as if that were not enough for this sick judge, he illegally "imputed" an income for me into the child support calculation that I had only earned once in my entire career, to 'jack up' the monthly child support order for increased federal funding, causing the order to be *more* than I was earning at the time. This set in motion a "crime spree" in two states to criminalize me under the guise of child support enforcement, once again just to maximize federal funding. Over 30 judges and over 100 government officials have now been involved in my cases, and there is still no end in sight for my family's ordeal.

In dealing with the never-ending oppression over the past 10 years, I have written over 700 letters, I have made over 800 telephone calls, and I have submitted over 650 court documents, but have never received even a sliver of justice or protection for my family. And currently in Jefferson County, 3 new judicial officials and the new district attorney and new sheriff are conspiring, ignoring evidence, and blatantly committing misprision of felony, this time mainly to protect their predecessors from the charges they deserve.

Over the years, I have become an expert in the "case fixing" and racketeering taking place with impunity from coast-to-coast in our country in family law and the criminal justice system to take advantage of the young, the poor, the pro se, and the ignorant. The problem in Colorado seems to be that it's laws are not being followed, and consequences do not exist or are not enforced.

Colorado is definitely in need of an *effective* judicial review board, comprised of members inside and outside the legal field. It's becoming well-known all across the United States that police officers won't police other officers and judges won't judge other judges; they protect their own. The only way to stop the corruption is to promulgate consequences in the law and then to institute an *effective* judicial review board willing and able to punish the purveyors of injustice.

Put me on that board, and I'll clean up the corruption, quickly, so no other Colorado family has to suffer like mine.
