



## Conservation Trust Fund Expenditures for Select Counties April 2016

### Arapahoe County

Arapahoe County uses its Conservation Trust Funds to make debt payments on the construction of county fairgrounds building – specifically the 36,000 square feet outdoor covered arena which is used for rodeos, horse shows and other agricultural events and shows.

### Jefferson County

Projects awarded County Conservation Trust Funds for 2016:

- a) Friends of Dinosaur Ridge – stairway/ramps to access dinosaur tracks at Dinosaur Ridge - \$20,000
- b) City of Wheat Ridge – Picnic Shelters along Clear Creek Trail - \$88,000
- c) Ken Caryl Ranch Metropolitan District – Community Center Outdoor Restrooms - \$43,000
- d) Jefferson County Fairgrounds – various upgrades, repairs and replacement of equipment - \$500,000
- e) Jefferson County Shooting Range – New facility research and eventual creation - \$500,000
- f) CSU Extension – Demo garden maintenance at County Fairgrounds - \$15,000
- g) City of Lakewood – Carmody Park Phase 1 additional amenities - \$265,000

### Weld County

All of Weld County's Conservation Trust Funds for 2015 and 2016 support the Island Grove Regional Park – the site where Weld County holds the Independent Stampede, County Fair, Farm Show and numerous activities like regional horse and dog shows and music concerts.
