My name is Linda Hutchinson and I represent the League of Women Voters of Colorado. The League is a nonpartisan organization that encourages informed and active participation in government and influences public policy through education and advocacy. Our membership includes over 2,300 members and spans the state of Colorado with 19 local leagues operating in several regions of the state. The Colorado League of Women Voters strongly supports News Access for Consumers Who are Print-Disabled.

A goal of the League of Women Voters of Colorado is the practical application of diversity, equity, and inclusion because it is central to engaging all individuals in creating a more perfect democracy.

Another goal of the League of Women Voters of Colorado is equality of opportunity that includes education and employment for all persons in Colorado, regardless of their race, color, gender, religion, national origin, age, sexual orientation, or disability.
